PARR, JOHN. B.A. 1517-8.

PARR, JOHN. Adm. sizar at TRINITY, May 24, 1659. Matric. 1659; B.A. 1662. (See the next.)

PARR, JOHN. 'M.A. from TRINITY, 1662.' B. c. 1633. Ministered for a time to the D'ruwen nonconformists and also at Walton and Preston, enduring considerable persecution. Mentioned by *Calamy* as still living at Preston in 1713. Admon. of John Parr, of Preston, granted in 1716. (Probably same as the above.) (*D.N.B.*)

PARR, JOHN. Adm. pens. at JESUS, July 5, 1689; schola from St Paul's School. S. of James, of London. Matric. 1690; B.A. 1693-4; M.A. 1707. Ord. priest (Chichester) Feb. 16, 1697-8, age 24. R. of Radipole and Melcombe Regis, Dorset, 1698-1723. Chaplain to the Duke of Bolton. R. of West Chickereil, 1707-23. Perhaps a chaplain in the Navy, in 1711. Died 1723. (F. S. Hockaday.)

PARR, JOHN. Adm. Fell.-Com. at PEMBROKE, Feb. 22, 1736-7. S. of —, of Salthouse, Norfolk, Esq. Matric. 1738.

PARR, NATHANIEL. Adm. sizar at EMMANUEL, May 10, 1669. Of Lancashire. Matric. 1669; B.A. 1672-3; M.A. 1676. Signs for deacon's orders (London) Sept. 19, 1673; 'C. of St Peter's, Cornhill'; for priest's, June 13, 1674. V. of Towcester, Northants., 1676-80.

PARR, PETER. Adm. sizar (age 18) at St JOHN'S, May 20, 1708. S. of Philip, butcher, of Derby. B. there, 1690. School, Derby (Mr Blackwell). Matric. 1708; B.A. 1711-2; M.A. 1731. Ord. deacon (Ely) Feb. 21; priest, Feb. 28, 1713-4. V. of Alstonfield, Staffs., 1714. Died Sept. 12, 1764. (*Nichols*, iv. 725^o.)

PARR, RICHARD. B.D. 1626 (Incorp. from Oxford). Of Lancashire, pleb. Matric. (Brasenose College, Oxford) Nov. 24, 1609, age 17; B.A. 1613; M.A. 1616; B.D. 1624; D.D. 1634. Fellow of Brasenose, 1616. R. of Ladbroke, Warws., 1626-8. R. of Eccleston, Lancs., 1629-43, sequestered. Bishop of Sodor and Man, 1635-44. Married Elizabeth, dau. of Thomas Raymond, clerk, of Guildford, Surrey, Nov. 16, 1624. Died at Sodor and Man, Mar. 1644. (*Al. Oxon.*; *D.N.B.*)

PARR, RICHARD. Adm. pens. (age 18) at St JOHN'S, Aug. 24, 1649. S. of Edward, husbandman, of Lowton, Lancs. School, Winwick. Matric. 1650; B.A. 1653-4; M.A. 1657. V. of Chippenham, Cambs., 1659; ejected, 1662. Lived afterwards in the family of Henry Cromwell. One of these names of Camberwell, Surrey, clerk. Will (P.C.C.) 1692. (*Calamy*, i. 247.)

PARRE, ROBERT. Matric. Fell.-Com. from St CATHARINE'S, Michs. 1555.

PARR, ROBERT. Adm. sizar (age 20) at CHRIST'S, June 21, 1648. S. of Philip. B. at Derby. Matric. 1648; B.A. 1651-2; M.A. 1655. One of these names R. of Little Chishall, Essex, 1662; of Great Chishall, 1663-84. Admon. (Cons. C. London) Jan. 9, 1684-5. But see *Al. Oxon.* for a contemporary. (*Feile*, i. 522.)

PARRE, ROBERT. M.A. 1697 (Incorp. from New Inn Hall, Oxford). Matric. there, Mar. 27, 1685, age 17. S. of Robert, R. of Kirkby Mallory, Leics. B.A. (Oxford) 1688; M.A. 1691. R. of Willey, Warws., 1701. An excellent scholar. 'He loved not money but the Greek Fathers, the Pretender and the Church.' Buried at Hinckley, Leics., Aug. 8, 1750, aged 87 (*sic*). (*Al. Oxon.*; *Nichols*, iv. 725.)

PARR, ROBERT. Adm. at KING'S, a scholar from Eton, 1722. S. of Samuel, V. of Hinckley, Leics. Bapt. at Stoke Golding, Leics., Nov. 27, 1703. Matric. Easter, 1723; B.A. 1726-7; M.A. 1731. Fellow, 1726. Senior Proctor, 1738-9. Ord. deacon (Lincoln) May 28, 1727; priest, June 16, 1728. R. of Horstead and Coltishall, Norfolk. Died Sept. 8, 1759. Buried at Horstead. M.I. (*G. Mag.*; *Nichols*, iv. 725; *Harwood*.)

PARRE, SAMUEL. Adm. pens. at PETERHOUSE, June 29, 1583. Matric. 1583.

PARR, STEVENS (? STEPHEN). Adm. pens. (age 16) at SIDNEY, Jan. 1, 1697-8. 4th s. of John, mercer, of Northampton. Bapt. at All Saints', Northampton, Jan. 14, 1682-3. School, Houghton Conquest (Mr Scriven). Matric. 1698, 'John'; B.A. 1701-2; M.A. 1705. Ord. deacon (Peterb.) June 3, 1705. C. of Sprattton, Northants.

PARR, WILLIAM. Educated at Cambridge under Cuthbert Tunstal. S. of Sir Thomas, K.G., of Kendal, and of Greens Norton, Northants. B. Aug. 14, 1513. Created M.A. 1570-1. Knighted, Oct. 18, 1537. Steward of the Manor of Writtle, Essex, 1540. Privy Councillor, and Lord Warden and Keeper of the Marches, 1543. K.G., 1543; degraded, 1553; restored, 1559. Created Earl of Essex, 1543, and Marquis of Northampton, 1547. Adm. at Gray's Inn, 1560. A prominent supporter of Somerset, and afterwards of Northumberland. Supported the cause of Lady Jane Grey. Condemned to death on Mary's triumph, but pardoned with the forfeiture of his title and estates. Reinstated on the accession of Queen Elizabeth. Died Oct. 28, 1571. Brother of Catherine Parr. (*D.N.B.*; *Cooper*, i. 296, 558.)

PARRAN, ROBERT. Adm. pens. (age 19) at TRINITY, June 27, 1698. S. of John, of Gloucestershire. School, Westminster. Matr. c. 1698; Scholar, 1699; B.A. 1701-2; M.A. 1705; B.D. 1712; D.D. 1728 (*Com. Reg.*). Fellow, 1704. V. of Bottisham, Cambs. V. of Kemsing, Kent, 1720-39. Admon., P.C.C.

PARRAT or PARROTT, see also PERROT.

PARRATT, CHRISTOPHER. Matric. sizar from QUEENS', Michs. 1601. Of Cumberland. B.A. 1606; M.A. 1609. Ord. priest (Chester) Nov. 26, 1609. R. of Kirklington, Cumberland, 1611-43, evicted by Sir Edward Musgrave, patron of the living. (*B. Nightingale*, 308.)

PARRATT, FRANCIS. Adm. sizar (age 17) at St JOHN'S, Mar. 31, 1677. S. of Francis. B. at Audley, Staffs. School, Audley (Mr Butler). Matric. 1677; B.A. 1680-1. Lecturer for 50 years in Halifax parish church. Died Dec. 22, 1741, aged 82. M.I. at Halifax. Perhaps father of the next. (J. Watson, *Halifax*.)

PARRAT, FRANCIS. Adm. sizar at JESUS, July 6, 1704. Of Yorkshire. Perhaps s. of Francis (above). Matric. 1704; B.A. 1707-8. Ord. priest (York) May, 1711. Perhaps C. of Chapelthorpe, Yorks. If so, died July 19, 1726.

PARROT, HENRY. Adm. pens. at CLARE, June 26, 1701. B. at Old Weston, Hunts. Matric. 1701; B.A. 1704-5. Ord. priest (London) Mar. 22, 1712-3. V. of St Ives, Hunts., 1716-7. V. of Kimbolton, 1717-23. R. of Swineshead, 1717-22. R. of Holywell and Needingworth, 1722-57. Preb. of Lincoln, 1729-57. Died 1757.

PARRATT, JOHN. Matric. sizar from TRINITY, Michs. 1587. B. at Shillington, Beds., 1573. Scholar, 1590; B.A. 1592-3; M.A. 1596. Ord. deacon (Lincoln) 1597; priest, Mar. 26, 1599. V. of Shillington, 1599 (presented by Trinity). Will (P.C.C.) 1644-5.

PARRATT, JOHN. Matric. sizar from TRINITY, Michs. 1628; Scholar, 1631; B.A. 1632-3; M.A. 1636. Fellow, 1633. Ord. deacon (Lincoln) June 5; priest, Dec. 8, 1642.

PARRAT, JOHN. Adm. sizar (age 18) at TRINITY, Mar. 14, 1710-1. S. of Thomas, of Shillington, Beds. School, Eton. Matr. c. 1712; Scholar, 1714; B.A. 1714-5. Ord. deacon (Lincoln) May 27, 1716.

PARRETT, PHILIP. Matric. pens. from St JOHN'S, Easter, 1613.

PARROTT, RICHARD. Adm. sizar at CLARE, Feb. 25, 1739-40. B. at Coventry. Matric. 1740. Migrated to Queens'. Oct. 15, 1743. B.A. 1743-4.

PARRATT, THOMAS. Adm. pens. (age 17) at St JOHN'S, June 8, 1703. S. of Thomas, deceased. B. at Catworth, Hunts. School, Huntingdon (Mr Mathews). Matric. 1703; M.B. 1710; M.D. 1722. F.R.C.P., 1730-41. Will (P.C.C.) 1741. Father of the next. (*Munh*, ii. 116.)

PARRATT, THOMAS. Adm. pens. (age 18) at St JOHN'S, Oct. 25, 1733. S. of Thomas (above), M.D., of Middlesex. B. in London. School, Bury (Mr Kinsman). Matric. 1735; B.A. 1737-8. Ord. deacon (Lincoln) June 1, 1740. C. of Holywell, Hunts.

PARATT, —. M.A. from CORPUS CHRISTI, 1604 (in *ordo*).

PARRELL, —. B.A. 1528-9.

PARROCK, THOMAS. Adm. pens. at JESUS, Jan. 19, 1620-1.

PARRY or PARRIE, CHRISTOPHER. Adm. sizar (age 22) at CAIUS, July 2, 1603. S. of Richard, R. of Ammere, Norfolk. School, Lynn. B.A. (?); M.A. 1604. Licensed to teach grammar, 1606. Ord. deacon and priest (Norwich) Sept. 25, 1608, as C. of Thursford, Norfolk; of Trimmingham, in 1617; of Reepham, in 1627. (*Venn*, i. 182.)

PARRY, DANIEL. Mat. ic. pens. from St CATHARINE'S, Easter, 1613.

PARRY, DAVID. Adm. sizar (age 17) at St JOHN'S, June 30, 1705. S. of Henry, gent. B. at Ceiriog, Denbigh. School, Northop, Flintshire (Mr Lloyd).

PARRY, EVANS. Matric. sizar from QUEENS', Michs. 1566.

PARRY, EZEKIEL. Adm. sizar at EMMANUEL, May 19, 1670, as Porry. Of Nottinghamshire. Matr. c. 1673; B.A. 1673-4. Ord. deacon (York) June; priest, Dec. 1674.

PARRY, GABRIEL. B.A. from JESUS, 1604-5; M.A. 1608. Incorp. at Oxford, 1615. B.D. (Hart Hall, Oxford) 1615. Head Master of Ruthin School, 1607-9. R. of Llandegla, Denbigh, 1608. V. of Llanrhaidr-y-n-Mochnant, 1608. V. of Henllan, 1609-13. V. of Denbigh, 1613. V. of Abergelge, 1613-53; deprived but restored, 1660-2. R. of Llysfaen, Carnarvon, 1613. Preb. of St Asaph, 1614. R. of Llaisant-fraid-y-n-Mechain, Montgomery, 1617-63. R. of Lia sannan, Denbigh, 1617. R. of Llanychan, 1628. R. of Llanyhafal, 1632-5. Precentor of Bangor, 1632-4. Died 1662 (*sic*). Nephew of Richard, Bishop of St Asaph. (*Al. Oxon.*; Newcome, *Memoir of Gabriel Goodman*, App. S; Thomas, *St Asaph*, iii. 192.)

PERNE, ROBERT. Matric. sizar from PETERHOUSE, Easter, 1577. S. of William, and nephew of Andrew (1537-8). B.A. from Corpus Christi, 1580-1; M.A. 1584. Ord. deacon and priest (Lincoln) Oct. 10, 1582. R. of Southery, Norfolk, 1588-9. V. of Chettisham, Cambs., 1599-1614. Subsequently of Ely. Probably a vicar of the Cathedral. Brother of the next and Richard (1564).

PERNE, THOMAS. Matric. pens. from PETERHOUSE, Michs. 1573. S. of William, and nephew of Andrew (1537-8). B.A. 1577-8; Scholar, 1579; M.A. 1581. Fellow, 1580-5. Incorp. at Oxford, 1585. V. of Melbourn, Cambs., 1581-2. V. of Chery Hinton, 1582-8. R. of Wentworth, 1588. Married Katherine Rydley, of Downham, Cambs. Brother of Robert (above) and Richard (1564). (*T. A. Walker*.)

PERNE, THOMAS. Adm. pens. (age 15) at PETERHOUSE, July 7, 1625. S. of Andrew (1582), of Cambridge. Bapt. at Little St Mary's, Apr. 22, 1610. B.A. 1628-9; M.A. 1632. Buried at Grantchester, Cambs., Jan. 20, 1664-5. Brother of Andrew (1623) and perhaps father of the next. (*T. A. Walker; Ely Epis. Records*, 306.)

PERN, THOMAS. Adm. pens. (age 17) at PETERHOUSE, Nov. 8, 1653. Of Cambridge. Perhaps s. of Thomas (above). School, Chesterford. Matric. 1655; Scholar, 1656; B.A. 1657-8.

PERN, —. Adm. Fell.-Com. at PETERHOUSE, Michs. 1564.

PERN, —. Adm. at CORPUS CHRISTI, 1569.

PERNHAM, see also PARNHAM.

PERNHAM, RICHARD. Adm. at CORPUS CHRISTI, 1596. Of Leicestershire. B.A. (? 1602-3); M.A. 1606; B.D. 1614. Fellow, 1607-8. Ord. deacon and priest (Norwich) Sept. 21, 1607, age 24. V. of Corringham, Lincs., 1610. V. of Stowmarket St Peter, Suffolk, 1625-8. Died Feb. 1, 1627-8. (*E. Anglian*, x. 195.)

PERPOYNT, see PIERREPOINT.

PERRERS or PERERS, JOHN. Scholar at KING'S HALL, 1336. Died July 6, 1349. (*Trinity College Admissions*.)

PERREERE, JOHN. Matric. pens. from PEMBROKE, Easter, 1647.

PERRINCHIEF, RICHARD. Matric. sizar from KING'S, Lent, 1637-8; 'Grecian' from Christ's Hospital. S. of Gabriel, joiner, of St Botolph, Aldersgate, London. Adm. at Christ's Hospital, Apr. 15, 1625, age 4. B.A. from Magdalene, 1641-2; M.A. 1645; D.D. 1663. Fellow of Magdalene, until 1650, ejected. Ord. deacon and priest (Lincoln) July 3, 1646. R. of St Mildred Poultry, 1661-73. Preb. of Westminster, 1664. Preb. of St Paul's, 1667. Sub-almoner to Charles II. Arch-deacon of Huntingdon, 1670-3. R. of St Mary Colechurch, 1672. Author, sermons, and controversial works. Died Aug. 31, 1673. Buried in Westminster Abbey. Will (P.C.C.). (*D.N.B.*; A. W. Lockhart.)

PERRING, JOHN. Adm. sizar at Jesus, Mar. 1647-8, as Perning. Of Lincolnshire. Matric. 1648.

PERRIN or PIRRYN, JOHN. M.A. 1586 (Incorp. from Oxford). Of London, pleb. Matric. (St John's College, Oxford) 1575, age 17, from Merchant Taylors' School; B.A. 1579; M.A. 1583; B.D. 1589; D.D. 1596. Fellow of St John's (Oxford) 1575 (sic). Regius Professor of Greek (Oxford), 1597-1615. Canon of Christ Church, 1604-15. V. of Worthing, Sussex, 1605-11. One of the translators of the Bible. Died May 9, 1615. (*Al. Oxon.*)

PERRINS, JOHN. Matric. sizar from St JOHN'S, Easter, 1613; B.A. 1616-7; M.A. 1620. Ord. deacon (Peterb.) Dec. 24; priest, Dec. 25, 1620. Perhaps R. of St Mary Castlegate, York, 1639-88. Died 1688.

PERYN (? PERNE), REGINALD. Matric. pens. from PETERHOUSE, Easter, 1557.

PERIN, THOMAS. Adm. pens. (age 16) at CATUS, Sept. 28, 1579. S. of Henry, gent. B. at Little Birch, Essex. Schools, Little Birch, Colchester and Bury. Matric. 1579. Probably adm. at St John's, Oxford, Nov. 1581. Adm. at Lincoln's Inn, Nov. 17, 1586. (*Venn*, i. 103.)

PERING, WILLIAM. B.Can.L. 1488.

PERROGER, PHILIP. M.A. 1612-3 (on vi it of Prince Charles).

PERRONETT, EDWARD. Adm. pens. (age 20) at St JOHN'S, July 8, 1741. S. of Vincent (next). B. at Sundridge, Kent. School, Sevenoaks (Mr Simpson). Joined John and Charles Wesley. Accompanied John Wesley on his visit to the north, in 1749. Became one of Wesley's itinerant preachers. Left the Wesleys and joined the Countess of Huntingdon's connexion, c. 1771. Finally became member of an independent congregation at Canterbury. Hymn-writer. Died Jan. 8, 1792. Buried in Canterbury Cathedral. (*D.N.B.*)

PERRONET, VINCENT. M.A. from CORPUS CHRISTI, 1724. S. of David, of St Giles-in-the-Fields, surgeon. B. there, Dec. 11, 1693. Matric. (Queen's College, Oxford) Dec. 1, 1714, age 18; B.A. (Oxford) 1718. C. of Sundridge, Kent, 1718.

V. of Shoreham, 1727-85. Intimate with John and Charles Wesley. Styled 'the Archbishop of Methodism.' Author, religious. Died May 9, 1785. Buried at Shoreham. Will, P.C.C. Father of Edward (above). (*Al. Oxon.*; *D.N.B.*)

PERROR, WILLIAM. Matric. pens. from SIDNEY, Easter, 1698. But *see* Prior.

PERROT or PARROTT, ANDREW. Adm. sizar (age 18) at St JOHN'S, Apr. 13, 1730. S. of Thomas (1698), clerk, of Yorkshire. School, Trentham, Staffs. Matric. 1730; B.A. 1733-4; M.A. 1738. V. of Bramham, Yorks., 1743. Probably R. of Stone, Staffs., 1744. Perhaps chaplain in the Navy, 1744-5. Died at Pershore, Worcs., Dec. 13, 1790, aged 79. Will, P.C.C. But according to E. L. Barnwell this was Andrew (a cousin), s. of Charles, Lord Mayor of York. The similarity of names and age makes identification difficult. (*Duc. Leod.*, 72; E. L. Barnwell, *Perror Notes*, 107.)

PERROT, ANDREW. Adm. pens. (age 18) at St JOHN'S, June 12, 1731. S. of Charles, merchant, of Yorkshire, and nephew of Thomas (1698). B. in York. School, Hull (Mr Clarke). Matric. 1731; M.B. 1738. Probably adm. at Leyden, Sept. 16, 1735. Practised as a physician at York. Died May 14, 1762, aged 49. (E. L. Barnwell, *Perror Notes*, makes Andrew, M.B., s. of Andrew of Hull, but this is probably a mistaken identification.)

PERROTT, CHARLES. M.A. 1659 (Incorp. from Oxford). S. of Edward, of Northleigh, Oxon., gent. Matric. (Orie College, Oxford) Apr. 9, 1647, age 18; B.A. 1649; M.A. 1653. Fellow of Orie, 1652. Adm. at Gray's Inn, May 26, 1646. Died Apr. 23, 1677. Buried at Northleigh. (*Al. Oxon.*)

PERROTT, GEORGE. Adm. pens. at SIDNEY, Aug. 14, 1616. Probably brother of Humphrey (1615).

PERROTT, HENRY. Adm. pens. at CLARE, Apr. 3, 1673. S. of Richard, of Rapahannock River, Virginia. Matric. 1673. Adm. at Gray's Inn, Nov. 14, 1674.

PERROT, HUMPHREY. Adm. pens. at SIDNEY, May 26, 1615. Perhaps of Bell Hall, Belbroughton, Worcester. Adm. at the Inner Temple, 1612-3. Called to the Bar, Nov. 26, 1617. Refused knighthood at the Coronation of Charles I. Probably brother of George (1616).

PERROT, RICHARD. Adm. pens. at SIDNEY, Apr. 1603. S. of John, citizen of London. B. in Lombard Street, London. Scholar, 1603; B.A. 1604-5; M.A. 1608; B.D. 1614. Ord. deacon (London) May 31, 1607, age 23. V. of Hesse, Yorks., 1615-41. V. of Hull, 1615. Preb. of York, 1626-41. Author of a sermon, *Jacob's Vows*, published in Cambridge, 1627. Died Dec. 19, 1641. Father of the next. (Nash, *Worcs.*, i. 448.)

PERROTT, RICHARD. Adm. pens. (age 15) at SIDNEY, May 31, 1645. S. of Richard (above), minister at Hull and Hesse, deceased. Schools, Rockcliffe (Mr Thompson) and Coxwold. Matric. 1645; B.A. 1648-9; M.A. 1652; B.D. 1659. Fellow. Incorp. at Oxford, 1657. Canon of York. Preacher at York Minster during the Commonwealth; ejected, 1662. Adm. extra-licentiate R.C.P., May 18, 1670. Practised at Barmston, Yorks. Died at York, 1670. M.I. at St Martin, Micklegate, York. (*Munk*, i. 360; *Le Neve, Mon.*, iv. 145.)

PERROT, ROBERT. M.B. from MAGDALENE, 1642.

PERROTT, THOMAS. Adm. pens. (age 16) at SIDNEY, Apr. 14, 1698. 4th s. of Andrew, Lord Mayor of York, 1693, and nephew of Richard (1645). B. at York. Schools, Wakefield and Beverley. B.A. 1701-2; M.A. 1705. Ord. deacon (York) Sept. 1707; priest, 1708. P.C. of Yarn, Yorks., 1712-24. P.C. of Kirk Levington, 1715-27. R. of Welbury, 1720. Preb. of Ripon, 1720-8. R. of St Martin, York, 1724-8. Married Anastasia, dau. of George Plaxton, of Berwick-on-Tweed. Died 1728. (His son George was Baron of the Exchequer; for whom *see* *D.N.B.*) *See* *Al. Oxon.* for a contemporary with whom he is apparently confused. Father of Andrew (1730).

PERRIT, —. 'B.A. of TRINITY College' (not found in our records). One of the 'enticed to pass over the seas' by the papist Speigniomaldus, c. 1594. (*Foley*; Dr Jessopp.)

PERRY, CHARLES. Adm. pens. (age 18) at CATUS, May 38, 1717. S. of John, attorney, of Norwich. B. there. Schools, Norwich (Mr Pate) and Bishop's Stortford (Mr Tuke). Scholar, 1717-22; Matric. 1718; M.B. 1722; M.D. 1727. Fellow, 1723-30. Will dated Mar. 4, 1729-30; proved (Norwich) Dec. 18, 1730. To be distinguished from the medical writer of these names for whom *see* *D.N.B.* (*Venn*, ii. 8, where the erroneous identification with the medical writer is corrected.)
