Canons; and that there should be always present two or three Residentiaries, and if there were but one, he should receive the Profits of the rest, and be obliged to continual Residence and Attendance; that any of the Architectors being chosen Residentiaries, they should be allowed, out of the twenty-fix Weeks, thirty always for their Visitations; that, though the Residentiaries should oversay their twenty-fix Weeks, the Overplus of that Time should not be taken into a new Year, and no Canon be reputed a Resident, unless he lived in a Prebendal Hous, and expended 1001, by the Year; that the Vicars should, in Lieu of their claiming a Right to assume the Residentiary's Table, have an Allowance of the Residentiary's Table, have an Allowance of the Ann. and a Stipend of 61. 131. 4d. over and above the 401. dee from the several thirty-fix Prebendaries.

The Number of Residentiaries is now limited to sive, boiz. the Dean and sour others, which are all elective except the Dean; though antiently (as above monitored) the Dean, Precentor, Chancellor, and Treasurer were, the Jure, Canons, and there were besides them generally three or sour others chosen to that Honour: And though there were so many of them, which lessened their Income, yet they always considered the Fabrick, and constantly set apart one Dividend to it, besides the Reventies belonging to it, as they do at this Day, the Church having always a list or sixth Share of the Residence-Money

annually divided and separated to its Use.

By a Statute lately obtained, the Dean has the Gift of, and is empowered to fill up the Vacancies that happen in the Number of Residentiaries; one only of that Number is required to reside at a Time, and the Term of Residence is contracted to three Months. The Dean resides three Months in the Year, but not in Turn with the other Residentiaries, so that during his Time there are always two in Residence.

APESTHORPE, or ABSTHORPE,

So denominated from a Parish in Nottinghamshire, where the Prebendary has the Impropriation and Advowson of the Donative, and all other jurisdiction there. In Thoroton's Nottinghamshire this Place is called Hubbshorp,
