- PARKES, [Widdensbury, Staffordshire,] sa. a fesse erm. betw. three goats' heads, coupéd, or.—Crest, in an oak-tree ar. a squirrel, sejant, ppr.
- Parkes*, gu. on a pale ar. three bucks' heads, cabossed, of the field.—Crest, a talbot's head, erased, gu. charged on the breast with a pheon or.
- PARKHILL, [Scotland,] ar. a stag, tripping, ppr. attired and unguled or.
- PARKINGS, gu. two chev. betw. three escallops ar.
- PARKINS, [London,] or, on a fesse, dancettée, sa. betw. ten billets erm. a sun, betw. two cross crosslets, fitchée, of the field.—Crest, a bull, passant, az. with wings endorsed, or, ducally gorged of the last. [*Granted 1589.*]
- Parkyns*, [Bonney, Nottinghamshire,] ar. an eagle, displayed, sa. on a canton or, a fesse, dancettée, betw. seven billets erm.
- Parkyns*, or, on a fesse, dancettée, sa. ten billets ar.
- Parkyns*, or, a fesse, dancettée, sa. betw. ten billets, erminois.
- PARKHURST, [London,] ar. a cross, ermines, betw. four bucks, trippant, ppr.—Crest, out of a pallisado coronet or, a buck's head, erased, ar. attired of the first.
- Parkhurst*, [Holle, Norfolk,] The same, adding a chief gu. charged with three crescents or. [*Granted 2d Elizabeth.*]
- Parkhurst*, [Guildford, Surrey,] The same.—Crest, a demi griffin, with wings endorsed, sa. holding in the dexter paw a cutlass ar. hilt and pomel or.
- Parkhurst*, [Sir Robert, Lord Mayor of London, 1635,] The same.

- Parler*, [Lancashire,] vair, over all, on a cross gu. a lion's head, erased, or.

- PARR, ar. two bars az. within a bordure, engr. sa. quartering *Codrington*, ar. a fesse, embattled, counterembattled, betw. three lions, passant, sa.—Crest, out of a ducal coronet, or, a dragon's head gu. betw. two wings, chequy, or and az. (the crest of *Codrington*.) [*Borne by Codrington Parr, Esq. of Stonelands, Devonshire, 1825.*]
- Parr*, or, three water-bougets sa.
- Parr*, [Backford, Cheshire,] ar. two bars az. within a bordure, engr. sa. bezantée.—Crest, a demi boar, rampant, az. bristled or, charged with a bend gu. thereon three lozenges or.
- Parre*, or, on a pale, betw. six roses gu. three roses ar.
- Parre*, [Kormuch, Lancashire,] ar. two bars az. in chief three torteauxes, all within a bordure sa.
- Parre*, [Devonshire,] erm. on a chev. gu. three martlets or.
- Parre*, ar. two bars az. within a bordure sa.
- PARRETT, or PERROTT, [Oxfordshire and Kent,] gu. three pears or, on a chief ar. a lion, issuant, sa.—Crest, a parrot, close, ppr. beaked and legged gu. holding, in his dexter paw, a pear or, and charged on the breast with a mullet of the last.
- PARRY, [Herefordshire,] ar. a fesse, betw. three lozenges az. within a bordure of the last.—Crest, three battle-axes, erect, ppr.
- Parry*, [Hamsted, Marshall, Berkshire,] sa. a chev. ar. betw. three boys' heads, coupéd at the shoulders ppr. crined or, round each neck a snake, tied, vert.—Crest, a cubit arm ppr. grasping a snake vert, biting the hand.
- Parry*, [Exeter, Wormbridge and Old Court, Herefordshire, and Warwickshire,] ar. a fesse,

- Perkins*, [Lincolnshire,] ar. a fesse, dancettée, betw. ten billets, ermines, four, three, two, and one. (*Another* bears the field or.)
- Perkins*, ar. a lion, passant, sa. betw. three fleurs-de-lis gu.—Crest, a lion, passant, sa. holding a fleur-de-lis gu.
- Perkins*, gu. two chev. betw. three escallops ar.—Crest, out of a five-leaved coronet or, a unicorn's head ar. maned and horned of the first.
- PERKINSON, *alias* FETHERSTON, [Durham,] gu. on a chev. betw. three ostrich-feathers ar. as many pellets.
- PERMIS, [Hawstall, Scotland,] az. three harts' heads, cabossed, ar.
- PERN, [Cambridge,] or, on a chev. betw. three pelicans' heads, erased at the neck az. vulning themselves gu. a mullet of six points, pierced, of the field.—Crest, out of a ducal coronet ar. a pelican's head or, vulned gu. [*Granted* 1575.]
- Perne*, [Ely, Cambridgeshire,] ar. on a chev. betw. three pelicans' heads, erased, az. vulned gu. an estoile or.—Crest, as PERN, of Cambridge. [*Granted* 15th June, 1575.]
- PERNEYS, or PERNYS, ar. a chev. betw. three pears az. (*Another*, vert.)
- PERON, [Quarley, Wiltshire,] quarterly, or and az. a cross, moline, gu.
- PEROT**, az. a bend, lozengy, betw. six martlets or.

- PERRIS, [London,] ar. on a chev. betw. three pheons gu. as many tigers' heads, erased, of the first.—Crest, a demi tiger, regardant, per chev. gu. and ar. holding in his dexter paw an arrow of the last.
- PERRY, or PERY, [Walter, Devonshire,] quarterly, gu. and or, on a bend ar. three lions, passant, az.—Crest, a hind's head, erased, or, holding in his mouth a sprig of a pear-tree vert, fructed of the first.
- Perry*, [Worcestershire,] ar. on a bend sa. three pears or.—Crest, a cubit arm, in armour, ppr. grasping in the gauntlet a sword ar. hilt and pomel or, strings and tassels, flowing from the pomel, gu.
- Perry*, or, a fesse, engr. az.
- Perry*, [London,] quarterly, or and sa. on a bend gu. cottised erm. three lions, passant, guardant, ar.—Crest, a hind's head, erased, ppr. gorged with a ducal coronet or, holding in his mouth a pear-tree-branch vert, fructed of the second. [*Granted* 8th March, 1700.]
- Perry*, quarterly, sa. and ar.
