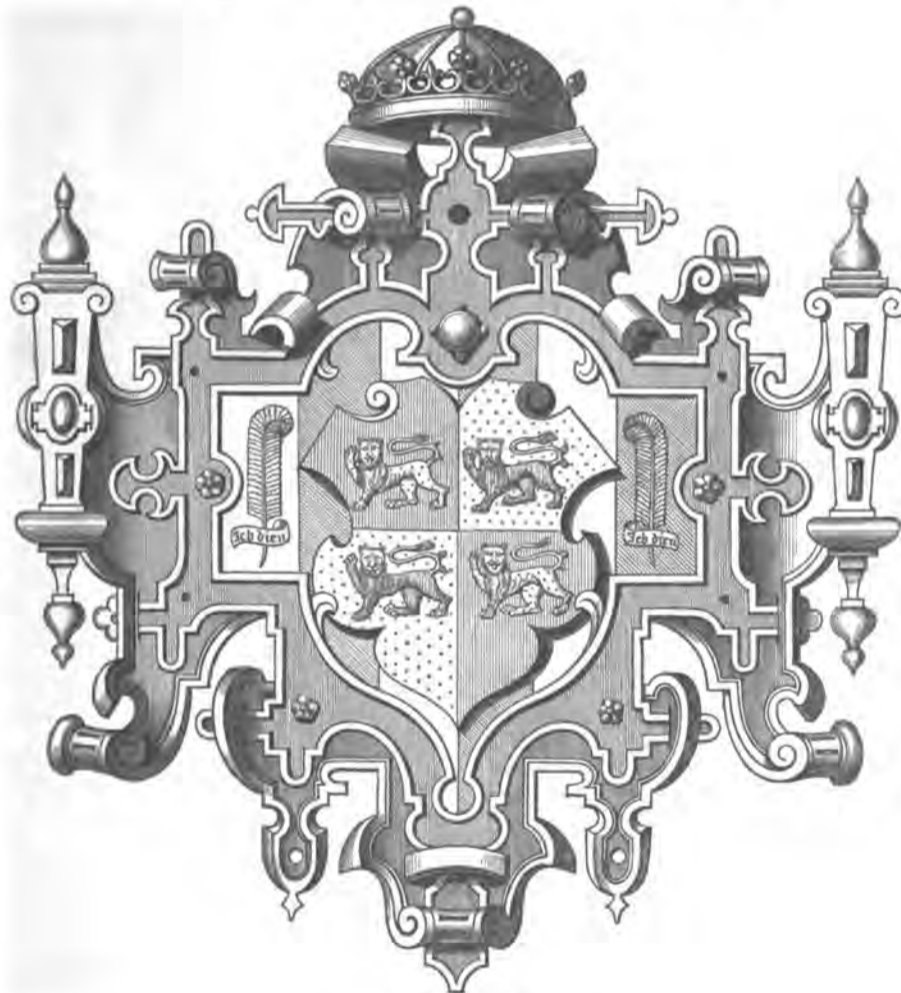

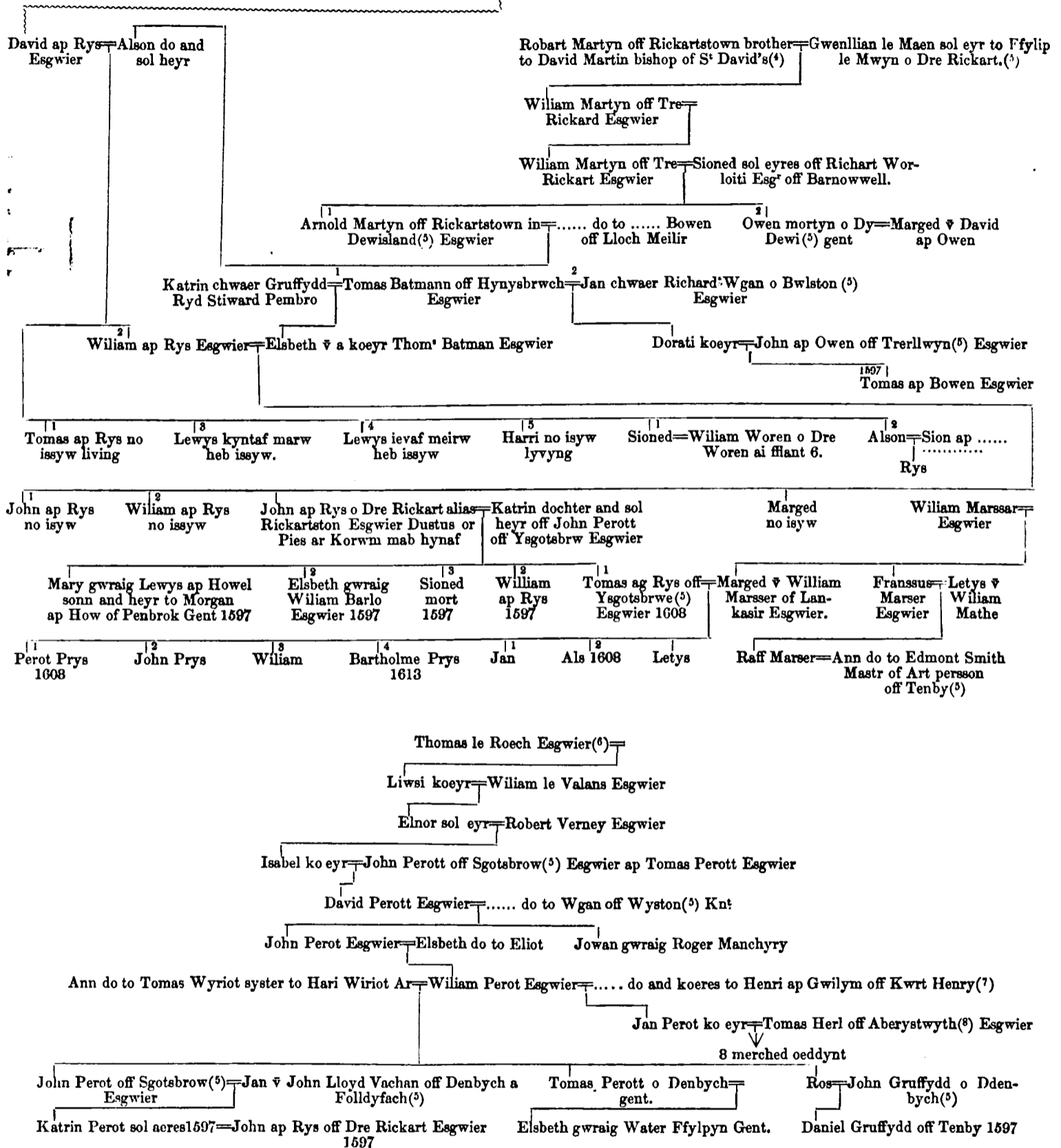
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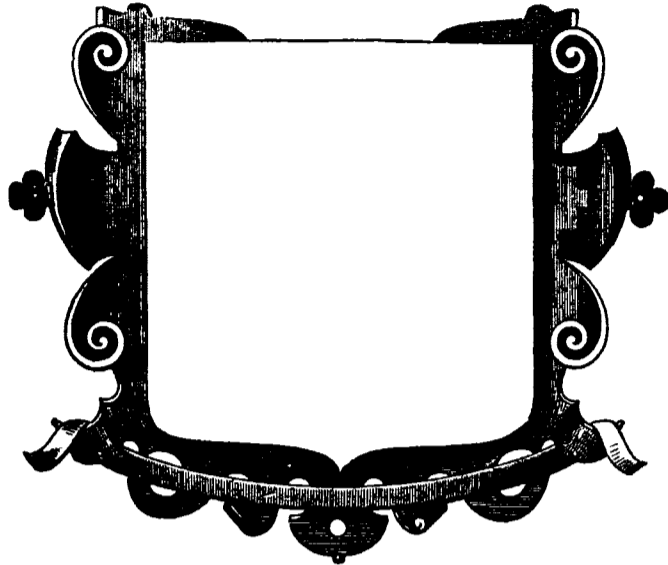

¹ Parish of Brawdy. ² "The county of St. David," that is, Pembrokeshire. ³ He lived at the splendid mansion of Carew Castle, and was buried at the priory of Carmarthen, whence his body and monument were removed to St. Peter's church in that town, the latter having been very awkwardly rebuilt. It has on it his effigy in armour, and in the robe of the garter. In the "Cambrian Register" is a curious life of him. ⁴ The only bishop of St. David's named Martyn was Richard, who held the see from the 36th April, 1482, till about a year after, when he died, and was buried in St. Paul's Cathedral, London. ⁵ In Pembrokeshire.

⁶ This Thomas le Roech is no doubt one of the family of De Rupe or De la Roche, the first of whom mentioned was Adam de Rupe, who endowed the priory and who built Roch castle on a rock, in Pembrokeshire. Mr. Fenton says, the male line became extinct in the time of Richard II. by the death of Thomas de la Roch in 1386, who left two daughters; but he could not be the above, as these daughters were Elen married to Edmond de Ferrers fifth Lord Ferrers of Chartley, and Elizabeth to Sir George Longeville. This was also the son of John de la Roche, (1375) the son of Robert, son of William, son of Thomas, son of John, son of Adam de la Roche above mentioned. ⁷ In Carmarthenshire. ⁸ In Cardiganshire.

Malmabury p. 158; for Syr Stephen Perott the first Norman settler in Pembrokeshire married Elen daughter of Meirchion ap Rhys ap Rhydderch, ap Iestyn, ap Gwrgan, ap Howel Dda, from which Iestyn this place received its name.

⁶ Sir Robert Naunton in his *Fragments Regalia* tells us, that this lady of Henry VIII.'s court "was of the king's familiarity," and speaking of his son, afterwards Sir John Perott, adds; "if his picture, quality, gesture, and voice be compared with that king's, they will plead strongly that he was a surreptitious child of the blood royal." Henry VIII. made her husband Gentleman of the Bedchamber and knighted him.

This pedigree appears to agree with one in Vincent, 135. p. 580. Penelope daughter and heir of Sir Thomas Perrot, who is mentioned on the other side (p. 90,) married Sir William Lewes, and secondly Sir Robert Naunton, Secretary of State, in the time of James I. (See also a future page.) Sir Thomas Cheney, K. G. was great grandfather to Penelope. The family of Perott came in with William the Conqueror.

⁷ He was Lord Deputy of Ireland in the time of Queen Elizabeth, had been created knight of the Bath by Edward VI. and was born at Haroldston, in the county of Pembroke, which his family had acquired by a marriage with Alice daughter and sole heiress of Sir Richard Harold, though it has been said that this place became their property by the marriage of Sir Herbert Perott, of Herefordshire, with Sybilla daughter and co-heiress of Thomas Lloyd, Esq. He had a grant of Carew and Laugharne castles, from Henry VIII. his father according to Naunton, and in 1533 entertained in the former the Earl of Ormond. He was recalled from Ireland in 1588, and in 1592 was tried and found guilty of high treason, when death in the Tower of London saved him from the ignominy of the scaffold. Dr. Rawlinson wrote and published his life.

Perrot and Master Cooke were both in like armour, beset with apples and fruit, the one signifying Adam and the other Eve, who had hair hung all down his helmet," an extravagance of fancy which appears to exceed all the devices of that fantastic age.

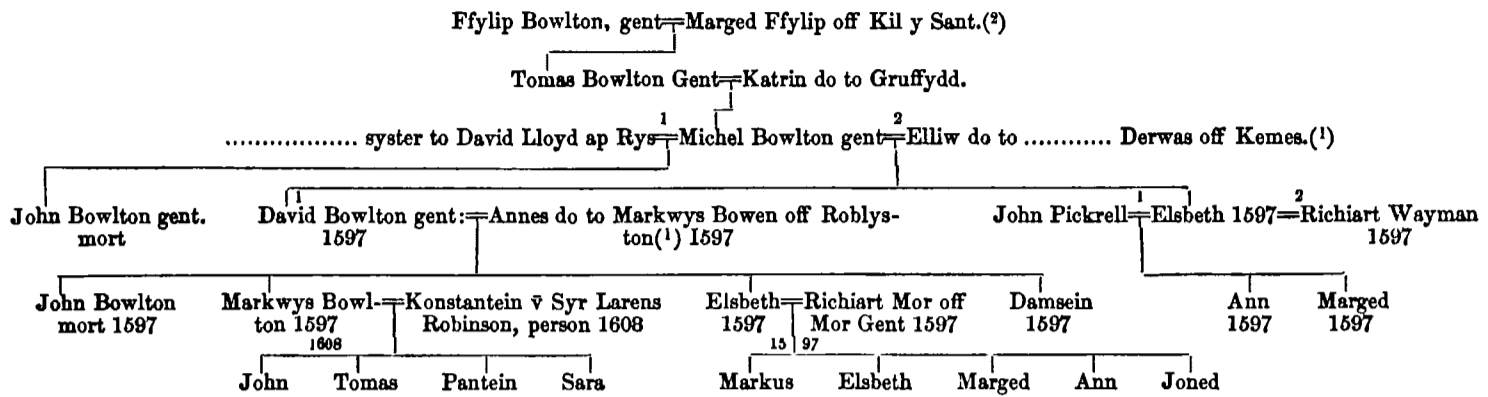

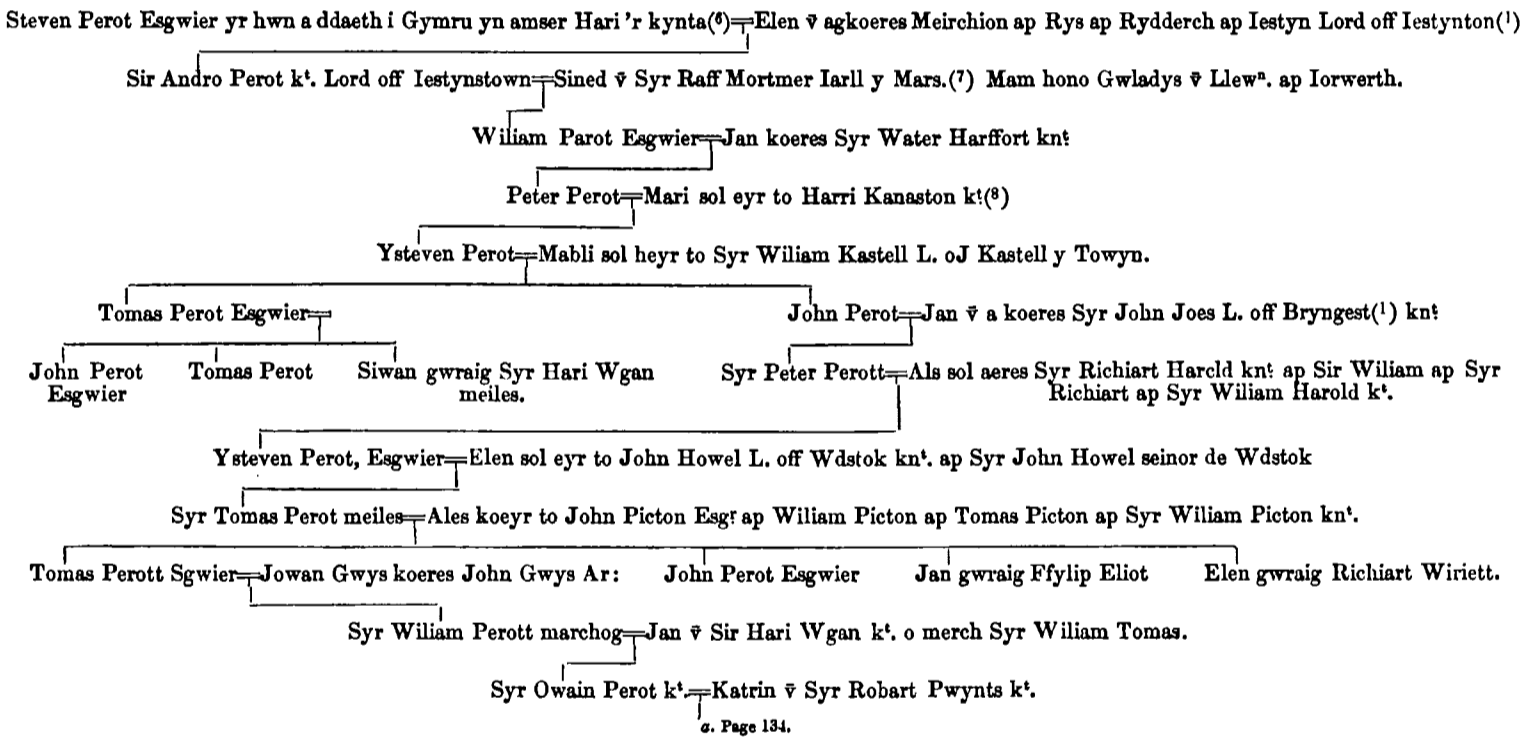

⁵ Sir Gilbert Dethick was created Garter by patent, on the 20th of April, 1550; and dying on the 3d of October, 1584, at the age of 81, was succeeded by Sir William, his second son, on the 21st of April, 1588, who surrendered in 1608, and died in 1612, aged 70. In the Cotton Library, at the British Museum, is a curious statement by "P. Yorke Herault," marked Faust E. II. fol. 216, intended to shew that Sir William was not of English descent, thus:—

"Robert Derick a duche man born, and by occupation a forger of armore, came into England w^t Erasmus Crakener, = Agatha daughter of Mathyas Leyendecker, a duche bar-bore, dwellinge in the cytie of Acon in Germany, was wife to Robert Dericke and had issue by him 3 sons. Yeoman Armorer to King Henry 8, and did forge armore for y^e said kinge at Greenwich for 10 pence by the day; he died before his 3 sonns were made denysons, as appeareth by y^e Acte of P^lliament 33 H. 8.

Dericke Mathew Dericke 2d sone by that name, exhibited a pe^tion to kinge Edw⁶ that he might sett up a shope in London and teache Englishmen to make armore. He had of the said kinge 10 pence by day as his father had of kinge Hen 8.

Gibert Dericke, by that name 25 Hen 8. was created Hamps pursuevant extraordinarye on Corpus Christy day, and understandinge himselfe not to be capable of any place ordinary in that office, beinge an alyan borne, procured a denyson by act of Parliament 33 Hen. 8. for himselfe and his 2 brothers, and therein did very untruely suggest to the said P^lliament that his father Robert Dericke was born in Derbyshire, and was of the family of Dethecke, w^{ch} they all denye.

Alice daughter of one Leonarde a duche shoemaker at y^e signe of y^e Rod Cocke in S^t Martyn's London.

He compliments him on his great wealth, valour, and influence, urging him to take vengeance for the loss sustained by the death of his father, in the battle of Danesmore, in Northamptonshire, adding, "Wherever the descendant of Gwalter Sais makes his appearance, wearing his white (i. e. bright steel) harness, he will excite attention." The same Poet wrote an Elegy on his brother (the second son) Richard Vychan, Lord of Bleddvach, in which he tells us that he was buried in St. Mary's Church, Kington, "where his golden locks are now concealed from view beneath a monument of white marble." This no longer exists; but that of their father, Thomas ap Rosser Vychan, Esq., and their mother, Elen Gethin, may still be seen in that Church, with their recumbent effigies, though in a mutilated state, in juxta position; yet the Poet informs us that there were "figures of angels on the tomb, bearing escutcheons, with the arms of the Vaughans emblazoned." He is in armour, without

any covering on his head, which reclines on his tournament helmet, with the crest, apparently a cumbent bird upon it. His legs have been broken off below the knees, and his sword knocked away. The style of his armour greatly resembles that of Lord Hungerford, at Salisbury. His Lady's arms have been destroyed from below the elbows. A lion couchant regardant is at her feet. Although Lewys Glyn Cothi was quite as much of a Lancastrian as a Yorkist, yet it was owing to his renown that this Lady invited him to Hergest, or Herast, to write the two Elegies on her husband, which have been handed down to us. His residence there produced the Elegy on her second son, the epithalamium on her daughter's marriage, and the two Poems to her eldest son. This Poet's works were soon after copied into what was called the Llyfr Coch, or "Red Book," of Hergest, which is now in the library of Jesus College, Oxford. The 10,000 Welshmen drawn together for the service of Edward IV. lost half their number in the field; and among them were Sir Roger Vaughan of Tretower, Kt., his second son, Watkyn Tomas of Talgarth, Thomas ap Richard Vaughan, and Henry ap Morgan. The Lord of Herast, according to the Poet, fell at the head of his men, "to be avenged by his three sons." He describes Hergest as in his time consisting of eight strong buildings, in each of which was a refectory, and a good stock of wine; but a small part now remains, and is occupied as a farm house.

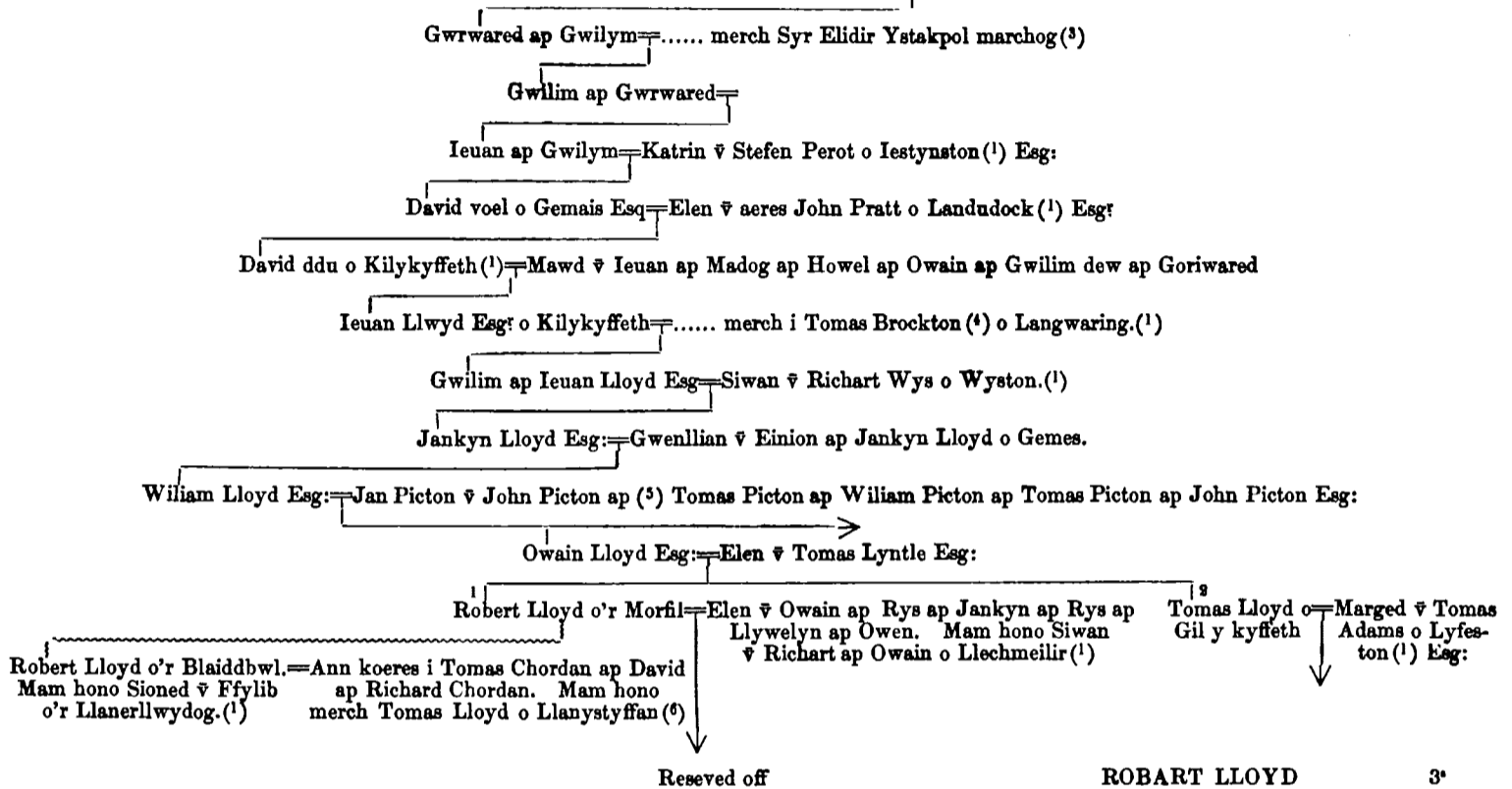

physicians. After his return to England, he collected a noble library of books of science and MSS., comprising 4,000 volumes, 1,000 of which were MSS., among which were large collections of original Irish and Welsh records, Welsh grants, donations, and pedigrees. The ignorant populace, who believed that he dealt with the devil, broke into his house in 1583, during his absence abroad, took away, and dispersed or destroyed what had cost him the labour of forty years, and a great expenditure of money. He did, actually, after this, practise necromancy, and disgusted foreign courts, to which he travelled, with his absurdities, so that the Queen sent for him to return. When he came to England, his friend, Sir Thomas Jones, offered him his Castle of Emlyn, in

Carmarthenshire, to live in, with all necessary accommodations; but this he declined, still choosing to live in his house at Mortlake, Surrey. King James did not at all notice him, so that he died very poor, in the year 1608, at the age of 81.
