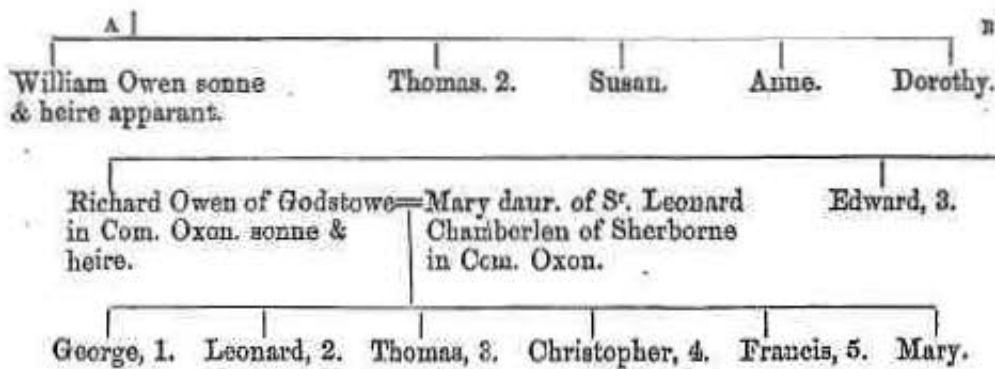

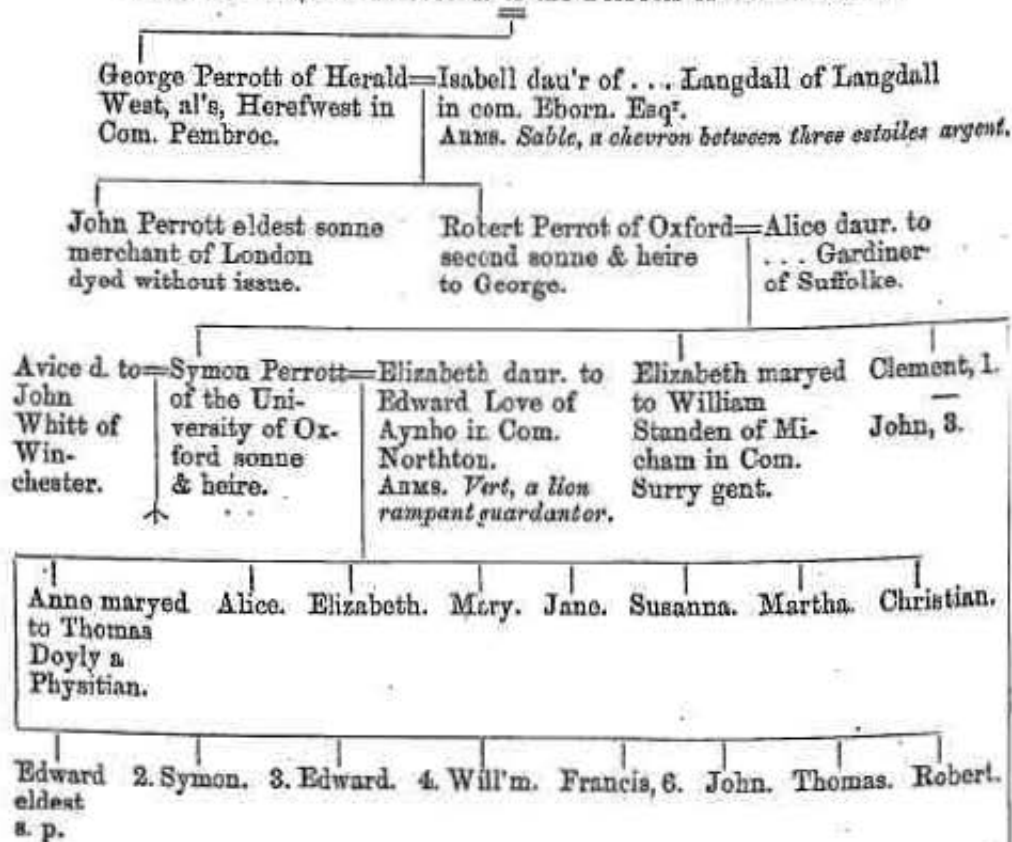

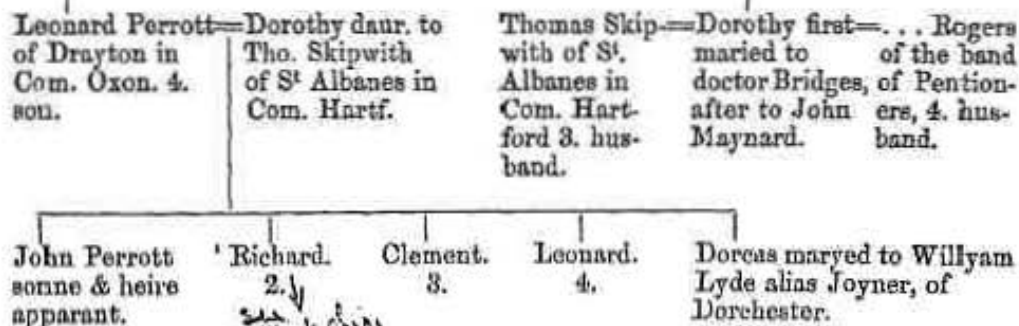
ARMS. *Gules, three pears or, on a chief argent a demi-lion rampant sable, a mullet charged with a crescent for a difference, [PERROTT], impaling, gules three bars or, in chief a greyhound courant of the second. [SKIPWITH.]*

CREST. *A parrot holding in its claw a pear or, slipped and leaved vert, having on its breast a mullet charged with a crescent.*

Note.—In St. Peter's Church, in the East, Oxford, is a fine mural brass to the memory of Simon Perrott, containing the following inscription, under the effigies of a man and woman kneeling at a desk, at his back are engraven nine boys, and at hers ten girls, with the arms of Perrott and Love :—

Here restith the bodies of Simon Parret
Gentilman: master of arte: late fellowe of
Magdalen olledge: and twice procter of the
unibersitie of Oxford: and Elizabeth his
wife: Doughter of Edward Love of Kenche
in the Coontie of Northhampton Esquier:
whiche Simon Departed this worlde the 24:
day of Septbr. in the yere of owre lorde God
mcccclxxxiv: and in the yere of his age 71:
and Elizabeth Departed in childbed the xxiiij
day of December in the yere of owre Lorde
God mcccclxxxij: and in the yere of her
age xliij.

Against the north wall of the Chancel of the Church of Northleigh are the proportions of a man and woman kneeling, having between them a desk, under is this inscription:—

Here lyeth Robert Perrot of North Leigh,
Gent. who married Mary, daughter of Oliver
Wethington, Gent. Doctor of Physick, by
whom he had iiij sons and iiij daughters.
And as he lived vertuously with credit, so
with assured faith in Chryste departed the
xxiiij. June. mdcv.

To whose memorie his loving wife in testi-
fication of her love, in dolefull duty erected
this monument.

The issue of the second marriage of Simon Perrott with Avisse White, is recorded in the North Leigh Registers, as follows:—

1576. 11. Jan. Symon fil. Sim. et Avis Parret, sepult.
1578. 25. Feb. Eliz. fil. Sim. et Avis Parret, bapt.
1580. 11. Sept. Maria fil. Sim. et Avis Parret, bapt.

In Wood's copy of the Visitation, the following entries occur:—

Mr. Simon Parrot & Agnes (Avis) White were wedded Jan. 29. 1673. in S^t Pet. in the East.

Rob. Perrot son of Simon aforesaid & Mary Withington were wedded in S. Pet. Ch. in y^e E. July 10. 1687. His son Edw. now lives at Northlee st. 85 or thereabout an. 1679.

Walter Perrot Son of Simon Perrot baptized in S. pet. parish in y^e East, Oxon. June 23. 1560.

Mary Perrot, bapt. there also Oct. 29. 1561.

Francis Perrot, bapt. there Apr. 25. 1563.

Jane Parret, bapt. there Apr. 30. 1566.

Martha Parret, July 19. 1667.

Susan Parret, Oct. 5. 1568.

ARMS. *Gules, three pears or, on a chief argent a demi-lion rampant issuant sable, a mullet charged with a crescent for a difference, [PEAROTT,] impaling, Quarterly of eight:—1 and 8. Gules, three bars or, in chief a greyhound courant of the second. [SKIPWITH.] 2. On a chevron cotised three lions rampant. (untinctured.) 3. Paly of six within a bordure engrailed, over all on a canton a spur (untinctured). [KNIGHT.] 4. Quarterly per fess dancettée, argent and sable, in the first and fourth quarters a bugle horn of the second. [FORSTER.] 5. Azure, three peacocks' heads erased argent. 6. Gules, on a fess or three fleurs-de-lys azure. [CRAWLEY.] 7. Gules, a lion rampant within a bordure engrailed or, over all a canton of the last.*

CREST. *On a wreath, argent and gules, a parrot vert, holding a pear or, slipped and leaved proper, charged with a mullet and crescent as in the arms for a difference.*

LEONARD PERROTT, of Drayton, in Com. Oxon. gen., second sonne to Robert, maryed Dorothy, daughter to Thomas Skipwyth, of St. Albons, in Com. Hertford, Esq., and by her hath yssue John Perrott, his eldest sonne and heire appar.; Richard, second sonne; Clement, third sonne; Lawrence (Leonard), fourth sonne, all unmarried; Dorcas mar. to Willm. Lyde al's Joyner, of Dorsetshire (Dorchester, Com. Oxon.)

Note.—Leonard perrott, 4. son of Leonard perrot, lived at Emsham com. Oxon. and married, by whom he had issue Rich. perrott, who married Prince, daugh. of prince of Berksire, w^{ch} Rich. had issue Franc. perrot, now living at Emsham 1666. æt. 53. who married Alice y^e daughter of Tho. Bowring of St Marie's parish, Oxon, vintner, who had issue one only son named Samuel, who died young in St Mar. parish 1600. and there buried.—Wood MS, D. 7. p. 14.

The North Leigh Registers contain entries of the burial of one branch of this family settled at Barnsley, Gloucestershire, as late as 1778.

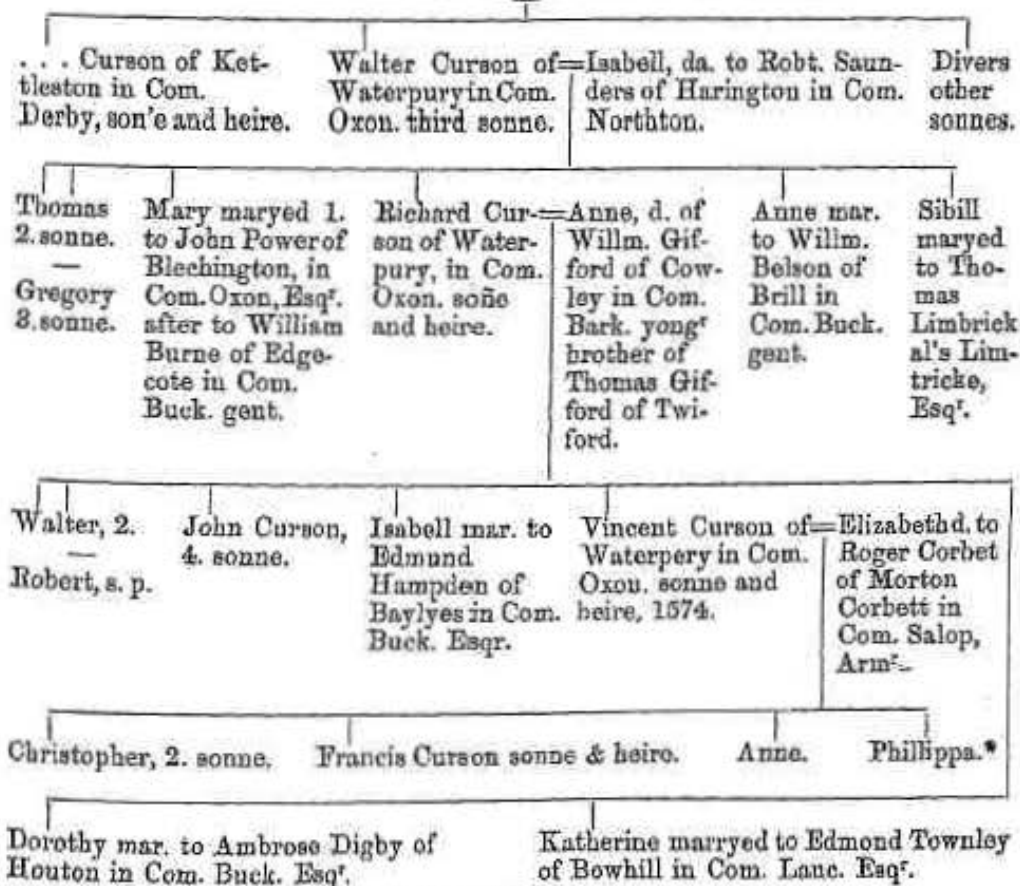

ARMS. Quarterly:—1. *Argent, on a bend sable three popinjays or.* [CURSON.] 2. *Argent, on a fess gules three hares' heads coupéd argent.* 3. *Paly of six argent and sable, on a chevron gules a cross crosslet or.* 4. *Per chevron, sable and gules three doves' heads erased argent. A mullet for a difference, impaling, Or, a raven sable.* [CORBET.]

CREST. *A popinjay or, beaked legged and collared gules, charged with a mullet for a difference.*

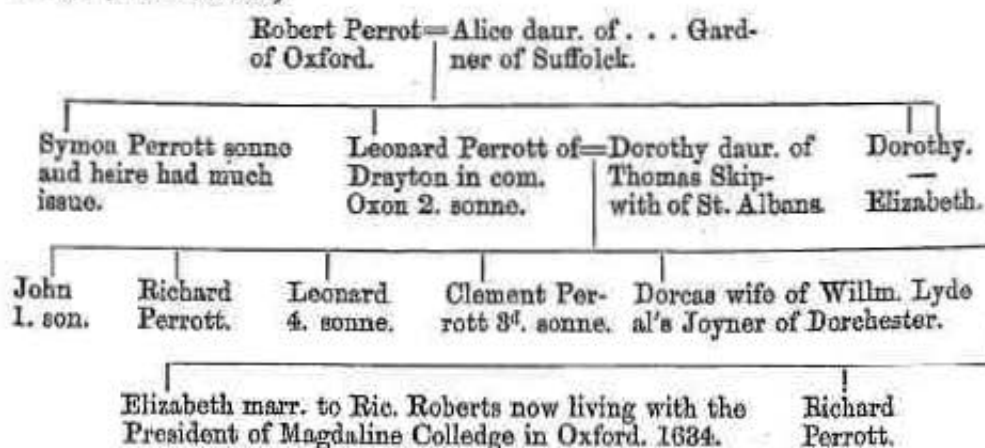
