Arms and Crest confirmed by Gilbert Dethick, Garter, on 4 January 1550 to Robert Perrot of Oxford, son of George Perrot, descended from Owen Perrot 'beinge the third Brother of the howse of Perrotes in Penbrokshyre'. The parrot in the Crest (on a wreath Argent and Gules) is blazoned A Parrot proper armed Gules, and painted green with a yellow breast and red beak and legs. CA, Vincent 162, p. 143. CA, C.29 is the Visitation of Oxfordshire 1634; f. 55v has a pedigree, Arms and Crest of this family.
