INTRODUCTION

When I was a small boy my grandmother told me about her husband, Elijah Thomas Parrott, who came to Texas from Tennessee as a young man with his parents in the late 1870's or early 1880's. His mother was Mary Stover. Mary's brother, Elijah Stover, had deeded a tract of land in Tennessee to Elijah Thomas Parrott in the event Stover had no children. Stover had married Parrott's aunt, Mickey Parrott. It was a pleasant surprise more than a century later for me to find this actual deed rerecorded in Overton County, Tennessee.

When I became interested in genealogy, my grandparents had died and no one could remember where Elijah Thomas Parrott had come from. Finally I read about Dr. William Giles Parrott, my great-grandfather, in The Story of Eliasville (Texas) by Thomas M. Cunningham, TH.D., which stated that the Parrotts came from Livingston, Tennessee, where many relatives still live today. Our genealogical researcher, Mrs. Jane Fullerton in Nashville, immediately uncovered a great deal of information about the Parrotts including the fact that more than one Stover had married into the Parrott family.

Mrs. Fullerton put me in touch with many Parrotts and Stovers who have supplied most of the information for this book. A twenty-four hour visit with Roy Parrott and his family in Overton County, Tennessee, led to friendships with these families. Clarice Stover Carmichael and Opal Parrott Stover immediately went to work compiling the genealogy of the Stovers and Parrotts in Overton County.

 We are still searching for the origins of our ancestors in Overton County - Lewis Stover, Sr. and his wife Elizabeth, and Benjamin Parrott and his mother, Elizabeth. We have spent more time researching their ancestry than we have on the rest of this book and would value any further information. I am sure we have misspelled names and listed incorrect dates and welcome any corrections and additions. We are family, not professional, genealogists, working for fun.

PART I
THE PARROTT FAMILY

THE PARROTT FAMILY

Parrott is an ancient name, said to originate in the Roman Empire where a "speaker" in the courts was called parrot after the talking bird. Variations of the name are common in France from the time of the Roman occupation. William the Conqueror brought Parrotts to England where they multiplied. Parrotts were among the early immigrants to the American Colonies before 1650 in New England, Maryland and Virginia. Early French settlers in America included Parrotts, and Huguenot Parrotts came to South Carolina and Georgia. Acadian settlers of Louisiana also included the Parrotts, frequently spelled Perrault. Other spellings are Parrot, Parot, Paret, Parrotte, etc. Christian names which occur with frequency among our Parrotts have been William, Richard, Benjamin, John, James, Elijah, Catherine and Elizabeth.

There is a tradition in our family that our Parrotts came from England to North Carolina possibly between the time of the American Revolution and the Civil War. Our study suggests that the family was in America before the Revolution. It is even possible that our Parrott immigrant came from England to Maryland in the seventeenth century.

The earliest Parrott ancestors we have been able to trace are Benjamin Parrott (c.1795-1839), his mother (or possibly grandmother) Elizabeth Parrott, Sr. (1750/60-1837) and a Benjamin Parrott we believe to have been his father (1765/75c.1820). It is also possible that an Elijah Parrott could have been Benjamin Parrott's (1765/75-c.1820) father. At least our Benjamin had a grandson named Elijah and there were Elijah Parrotts living in the 1770's in Halifax County, Virginia, where some of our family may have been at the time.

There were several Parrott families in North Carolina at the time of our Benjamin Parrott, Sr. One large family of Parrotts which should be considered as part of our family line was in Dodd County, the area later to become Lenoir County, in the township of Kinston. There are several suggestions of kinship: the oft repeated claim that our Parrotts came to Tennessee from North Carolina; the similarity of Christian names; the fact that our Tennessee Parrotts were staunch Disciples of Christ as were the Lenoir County Parrotts; Rev. Benjamin Parrott (1798-1858) of Lousan Swamp was an early member and minister of the Disciples of Christ Church at Kinston when it broke away from the Baptist Church in the 1830's. Another early minister in the same congregation was Rev. E. F. Giles. Our Benjamin Parrott, Jr. (1794-1839) may have been a relative of Rev. Benjamin Parrott and several other Parrotts (John, James, Joshua, Persis) who were early members of this congregation. He named a son, our great grandfather, William Giles Parrott, possibly in honor of Rev. E. F. Giles (Ref: Ware, Charles C., North Carolina Disciples of Christ; Christian Board of Education, St. Louis, Mo. 1927)

More than likely, Benjamin Parrott (1765/75-c.1820) was the name of our Benjamin's father. For the sake of simplification we shall use Jr. and Sr. to distinguish between the two. Benjamin Parrott, Sr.'s birthplace is unknown, but one family tradition relates that he was born in England as evidenced by a letter from Susan Janet (Parrott) Crump to Bonita (Parrott) Kelsey in 1942. Therein she stated that Benjamin Parrott, Jr.'s parents were born in England. It is possible that Benjamin Sr. was born in England, came to Virginia, migrated to

North Carolina and then to Georgia but died before his widow, Elizabeth Sr., moved to Tennessee.

A Benjamin Parrott lived in Hancock County, Georgia, and is listed on the Tax Rolls of Hancock County. Between 1807 and 1812, this Benjamin owned 600 acres - four farms with fifteen slaves to work them. In 1806, Elijah, James and Sherrod Parrott (possibly brothers of Benjamin Sr.) were among petitioners to reduce the limits of Jackson County, Tennessee or for the division of a county apart from Jackson. The same year, Overton County was formed where our family of Parrotts settled.

The earliest census report for Overton County was in 1820 which shows Benjamin Jr. living there with another male (age 16-26, possibly his brother, Riland), two females (age 16 to 26, possibly sisters) and one female over 45 years of age (probably his mother, Elizabeth). His father had evidently died prior to this year as he was not listed in the 1820 census. Elizabeth lived first with her son, Benjamin Jr, in Overton County and, in 1830, was living there with another son, Riland.

Elizabeth Sr. was born 1750/60, birthplace unknown. Her family settled in Georgia which is evidently where she met and married Benjamin Sr. After moving to Tennessee, she returned to Georgia at least once to visit a daughter, a fact stated in the suit concerning the estate of her son, Benjamin Jr., (Joel Petit vs. Riland Parrott) filed June 24, 1839, in Overton County. In this suit, Joel Petit, the administrator of Benjamin Jr.'s estate, fought for the rights of Benjamin's children which suggests that Petit may have been their grandfather. We have been unable to prove this speculation further. Elizabeth Sr. died in April, 1837, in Overton County. Her heirs, according to the suit, were Riland Parrott, Benjamin Parrott (Jr.), William Parrott, Peter Williams, Richard Hill, Isaac Hill and John Towers. Her property was distributed evenly between the heirs.

We believe that Elizabeth and Benjamin Sr. had seven children: Benjamin (Jr.), Elizabeth Jr., William, Riland, Margaret and two other daughters whose names are unknown (see below).

Elizabeth Parrott, Jr. was born between 1800 and 1805 and married Peter Williams. (They may have married about 1823 when her mother sold her two female slaves for \$500 (Whitley, Edythe Rucker; Tennessee General Records of Overton County, p. 36). The children of this marriage and the death dates for Peter and Elizabeth are unknown.) Peter was probably the son of William Williams and his wife, Elizabeth. William Williams' will, written May 3, 1840, named children Nancy McRay, Benjamin, Robert, William, C. W., John and Alfred. It also named R. W. and Peter (probably Williams) who were either brothers or sons of William (Tennessee Records of Marshall County, Will Book A, 1835-1855, p. 90). Elizabeth Williams' will was written February 15, 1850 (ibid, p. 232) and named sons Benjamin and Alfred O. Williams.

Margaret Parrott was born December 16, 1804, in South Carolina (1850 Maury County Census) and died July 8, 1888. Her place of death is unknown. She married Isaac H. Hill, who was born July 30, 1800, who died on September 30, 1840, by drowning. Isaac was the brother of Richard Hill (died 1845) who married Elizabeth Royal (born 1775) in 1799 in Caswell County, North Carolina (Tennessee Records of Marshall County, Will Book A, 1835-1855). Richard was also one of Elizabeth Parrott, Sr.'s heirs and the administrator of Isaac Hill's estate. Richard

had dealings with Benjamin Parrott, Jr. (Benjamin Parrott vs. Paul Chapin, Circuit Court Minutes of Overton County, Will Book A, 1815-1824, p. 205) and Riland Parrott (Petit vs. Parrott).

Benjamin Jr. had two other sisters whose names are unknown. One married John Powers and lived in Georgia as evidenced in Petit vs. Parrott in which Powers is named as Elizabeth Sr.'s son-in-law and is shown living in Georgia. One sister married Samuel H. Russell who was also named in Petit vs. Parrott as Elizabeth Sr.'s son-in-law. It seems that these two sisters never left Georgia.

We have only one record of William Parrott. He was named in Petit vs. Parrott and was alive in the 1840's.

Riland Parrott was born between 1800 and 1805 and either left Overton County or died before 1850. He was not listed in the census of Overton County in 1850. His wife's name is unknown but we do know, according to census reports, that she was born between 1810 and 1815 and they had six children. According to the 1830 and 1840 census for Overton County, a daughter was born between 1825 and 1830, another daughter between 1830 and 1835, one son born between 1830 and 1835, and three other daughters born before 1835. Riland's mother, Elizabeth Sr., was living with him in Overton County in 1830 per the census that year.

In 1839, after Benjamin Jr.'s death, Joel Petit, the administrator of Benjamin's will, filed suit against Riland Parrott. The suit alleged Riland had kept in his possession a note for \$400, part of the proceeds from the sale of a valuable slave, a blacksmith named Jerry; and also that the \$400 belonged to Benjamin's heirs. The suit proved the allegations and the note was awarded to the estate in September, 1841. The suit also established the identity of Elizabeth's heirs mentioned above and the fact that some of Elizabeth's family lived in Georgia.

Benjamin Parrott Jr. was born c. 1795. His birthplace is uncertain. The 1850 Overton County Census information reported by his children is conflicting. William Giles Parrott reported his father was born in Georgia; his daughter, Catherine Parrott Stover, gave North Carolina for his birthplace; and his son John Parrott, listed Virginia.

In 1811 a Benjamin Parrott was a lieutenant in the 35th Regiment, Tennessee Militia, and later served in the War of 1812 (Records of Commissions and Officers, 1807-1811, p. 60-62). He, among many others, petitioned the State of Tennessee on October 26, 1813, to enlist 500 mounted volunteers to take up arms against the Creek Nation of Indians (part of his Britannic Majesty's Savage Allies) and "fight them in their own savage way and to receive pay as other mounted soldiers." Benjamin was made a constable of Overton County on March 9, 1818. He was later accused of trover, that is, wrongfully converting another person's possessions to his own use. This offense usually referred to cattle or horses and resulted from lawsuits over the ownership of livestock.

In October, 1818, Benjamin was granted an unknown amount of acreage by the commissioners of Overton County in the town of Monroe (Overton County Deed Book D., p. 316). On October 30, 1818, Benjamin purchased two town lots in Overton County, #36 and #66 from James Wilson for \$33.00 (Overton County Deed Book E, p. 19). Benjamin then bought town lot #108 in Monroe from Solomon Huteburg for \$180.00 on January 21, 1819, (ibid, p. 20). Two lots in Monroe were sold to

Valentine Matlock on April 1, 1819 (ibid, p. 34) and two lots, #66 and 108, were sold to William Chilton, Jr. for \$320.00 on February 28, 1820 (ibid, p. 454). On November 18, 1825, the State of Tennessee granted 50 acres to Benjamin "on the waters of Eagle Creek" in Overton County (Grant #2903, Book F, p.235). The Overton County Tax Lists show Benjamin owning 128 acres and one black in 1836 and, in 1837, he had 175 acres worth \$500.00 and one black valued at \$800.00 (most likely this was the blacksmith, Jerry).

Benjamin's finances and health were poor for some ten years before his death in 1839 (Petit vs. Parrott). Benjamin's wife's name is unknown and there were four children, heirs unlisted by the census in 1840 but listed in 1850. A fifth unnamed son was listed in Overton County in 1830.

In the settlement of Benjamin's estate, the sale and partition of his lands, the four surviving children are listed as being Micah, William Giles, Catherine and John as well as an unnamed son who must have died in infancy. On July 16, 1859, William, John, Micah (and her husband Elijah Stover), and Kitty (and her husband Joseph Stover), deeded 139 acres on the waters of Eagle Creek to Solomon Selly for \$550.00 (Overton County Deed Book A, p. 98). That same day, all of these people agreed on the partition to Joseph Stover and Catherine Parrott Stover of 65 acres on Eagle Creek. This land was bounded by land owned by Lockhart, Goode and Elijah Stover and John Parrott (ibid). On July 25, 1859, William, John and Catherine and her husband Joseph Stover conveyed to Micah and Elijah the "same tract of land whereon the said Elijah and Michael (sic) now reside." The deed stated that the land would go to Elijah Thomas Parrott, the son of William Giles Parrott if Elijah and Micah died without children. If E. T. Parrott was deceased, the land would go to Joseph Benjamin Parrott, another son of William Giles Parrott (ibid). On September 9, 1859, they conveyed to John Parrott "the tract on which David Sidwell now lives" which comprised 65 acres on Eagle Creek (ibid).

MICAH PARROTT
(1822-1859/60)

The daughter of Benjamin Parrott

Micah (Michel, Michael, Mickey) Parrott, the daughter of Benjamin Parrott, was born in 1822 in Overton County, Tennessee. We know she died in 1859 or 1860 as she was mentioned in a deed in 1859 but not listed in the 1860 Overton County census.

Micah married Elijah Stover, the son of Lewis Stover, Sr. and his wife, Elizabeth. Elijah was born in 1813 in Tennessee. He was listed as a farmer in the 1850 Overton County census and in the 1870 census for that county. Bonita Parrott Kelsey claimed that he was also a physician. Micah and Elijah had willed in a deed dated July 25, 1859, that if they had no issue at the time of their death, the land was to be claimed for Elijah Thomas Parrott, Micah's nephew (the son of William Giles Parrott, her brother). Micah and Elijah had only one child, Westley, who evidently died at an early age as the land was inherited by Elijah Thomas Parrott who chose to pass it on to other heirs.

In 1861, Elijah Stover married Sarah Reneau who was born in 1819. There were no children of this marriage.

I. Westley Stover was born in 1845 in Overton County, Tennessee. There has been no further mention of this child.

This family is also covered under Elijah Stover (1813-1870+).

CATHERINE PARROTT
(1824-after 1860)
The Daughter of Benjamin Parrott

Catherine (Kitty) Parrott, the daughter of Benjamin Parrott, was born in Overton County on March 20, 1824, according to the date on her grave marker. In 1850 she was living with her sister and brother-in-law, Micah and Elijah Stover, in Overton County.

Catherine married Joseph W. Stover who was born in 1824 in Tennessee. Joseph was the brother of Elijah and son of Lewis Stover, Sr. and his wife Elizabeth. Joseph was a farmer in Overton County in 1860 according to the census that year. He died sometime after 1860, the last time he was listed in the census report.

Catherine and Joseph Stover had three children: Rebecca, Alexander and Sarah M.

- I. Rebecca Stover was born in 1854 in Overton County, Tennessee (1880 Census). No further information has been found on this child.
- II. Alexander Stover was born in Overton County in 1858 and died in 1919 in Memphis, Tennessee, where he is buried. He died on his return from a visit to his sister, Sarah, in Fredrick, Oklahoma. Alexander had married Frances Hill who was born in 1891 in Pickett County, Tennessee, probably in Byrdstown. She was the daughter of George W. Hill and Dicie Reynolds. Alexander and Frances had only one child: Jim Shelton.
 - A. Jim Shelton Stover was born in 1904 in Overton County. In 1925 in Walters, Oklahoma, he married Jessie Ruth Wampler who was born in 1908 in Weatherford, Texas. She is the daughter of Tennie Walter Wampler and Allie Sliger. Jim and Jessie had three children: Rosella Frances, Dorothea Ruth and Jimmie Ray.
 1. Rosella Frances Stover was born in 1926 in Walters, Oklahoma. She married Wesley C. Lavin who was born in 1918 in Fredrick, Oklahoma. He was the son of Thomas Russel Lavin and Martha Catherine Heather. Rosella and Wesley were married on May 1, 1950, in Walters. They had one child: Wesley C. Jr.
 - a. Wesley C. Lavin, Jr. was born in Hampton, Virginia, in 1951. He married Julie Lynn Bellamy.
 2. Dorothea Ruth Stover was born in 1932 in Walters, Oklahoma. She married Leslie E. Bonner who was born March 18, 1927, in Joplin, Missouri. They were married in Walters and have one child: Bretta Lynn.
 - a. Bretta Lynn Bonner was born in 1963 in Wichita Falls, Texas.
 3. Jimmie Ray Stover was born in Walters, Oklahoma in 1941. On December 27, 1960, he married Lahoma Jean Curtsingle in Walters. She was born on May 21, 1942, in Walters and is the daughter of Jimmie

Curtsingle and Franklin Woodall. Jimmie and Lahoma had two children: Lenina Rae and Mitzi Gay.

- a. Lenina Rae Stover was born in 1971 in Lawton, Oklahoma.
- b. Mitzi Gay Stover was born in 1975 in Lawton, Oklahoma.

III. Sarah Michell (Mac or Sis) Stover was born in 1860 in Overton County, Tennessee, and died in 1931 in Fredrick, Oklahoma. Mac was married for a short time to John Martin whom she divorced (according to Dillard Martin, the son of John Martin and Sarah Vann, John's second wife. Later Mac married B. H. Hensley and went west. Mac and B. H. had three children: Gertrude, Beulah and Houston.

- A. Gertrude Hensley was born in Fredrick in 1900. She married Jim Kidwell.
- B. Beulah Hensley was born in Fredrick in 1902. She married Coy Hutton.
- C. Houston Hensley was born in 1905 in Fredrick and never married.

DR. WILLIAM GILES PARROTT
(1825-1905)
The Son of Benjamin Parrott

Dr. William Giles Parrott was born in 1825, probably in Overton County, Tennessee, and was a farmer and physician. Around 1847 he married Mary Stover who was born in Tennessee in 1826 and died March 11, 1893, in Texas. Mary was the daughter of Lewis Stover, Sr. and his wife Elizabeth. Mary suffered from asthma and the family moved to several locations, including Nashville, Memphis, Chattanooga, seeking a better climate. In a letter from Susan Janet (Parrott) Crump to Bonita (Parrott) Kelsey in 1942, "Nettie" recalled that Richard Giles and one of his brothers, upon reaching Young County, Texas, stated "Here we stop and for good. We're tired of rambling." On February 2, 1858, William Giles sold to Andrew Pritchett his townlots, #70, 71, 81 and 82, on the northwest corner of Livingston Square (Overton County Deed Book P, p. 311-312). On February 16, 1858, he sold to John Parrott and his heirs the land which was "the same conveyed by the said John Parrott to me which was all his interest in the lands of Benjamin Parrott" for \$300 (Overton County Deed Book A, p. 88). The family was living in Overton County in 1860 and were not located in the 1870 census. They evidently moved from town to town in Tennessee and then to Texas before 1880.

Upon reaching Texas, William Giles first settled in Montague and later in Eliasville, Young County, where the air was supposed to be good for asthmatics. He lived on a farm near the town and practiced medicine. William Giles later retired after the death of his wife in 1893 and then lived with one of his sons, Richard L. Parrott.

Family tradition states that William Giles Parrott served in the Confederate Army. He died on September 28, 1905, in Eliasville, Texas, and he and his wife are buried at Eliasville where tombstones mark their graves.

William Giles and Mary had five children: Joseph Benjamin, Richard L., Elijah Thomas, John W. and a daughter whose name is unknown.

- I. Joseph Benjamin Parrott was born in Overton County, Tennessee, in 1848. When his father moved to Texas in the 1870's, Benjamin moved to Arkansas and most likely settled in Van Buren near the family of his wife, whose name is not known. Benjamin died in his early fifties, around 1900, and left three children: John, Jack and May. Benjamin's brother, Elijah Thomas, came from Throckmorton, Texas, to take the three children back to raise them in Throckmorton.
 - A. John W. Parrott's birthdate and birthplace are unknown. After his father's death, he lived in Throckmorton, Texas, with his uncle, Elijah Thomas Parrott. John became a policeman or U. S. Marshall in El Paso, Texas, where he was shot to death while on duty. It is said that he was a huge man and fought in the Spanish-American War. His wife, name unknown, returned to Graham, Texas, after his death. They had one daughter who married a druggist.
 - B. Jack Parrott's birthdate and birthplace are also unknown. He moved to California in the early 1900's. During World War II he visited with

his cousin's family (Susan Janet Parrott Crump) in Throckmorton. It is unknown whether he married or had children.

- C. May Parrott's birthdate and birthplace are also unknown. She grew up with Richard Parrott's (her uncle) family in Young County. She married but her husband's name is unknown. (Ref for John Parrott family: Bonita Parrott Kelsey)

- II. Richard (Dick) L. Parrott was born on September 16, 185_, in Overton County, Tennessee. He came to Eliasville, Texas, with his father before 1880. Dick was a wagon boss for the Childress-Donnell cow outfit for several years. He married Josephine Morrow on November 18, 1885. Josie was born on August 16, 1863, in Coryell County, Texas, shortly after her father's death. Her mother died when she was twelve years old and she then lived in the home of Allen Elliott in Lone Oak, Texas.

After Josie and Dick were married, they settled on a farm three miles northwest of Eliasville. Around 1906 the Parrotts moved to Woodson, Texas, where they purchased ranches and farms which have proven rich in oil production. In 1906 they had 1600 acres in Woodson. Oil was discovered in Woodson in 1910.

Dick died on May 18, 1910, and is buried in Woodson. Josie died on August 4, 1949. They had eight children: Susan Janet, Lewis E., William Arthur, Don Orvil Hermon, James Ermon, Evelyn Virginia, Walter and Lloyd.

- A. Susan Janet (Nettie) Parrott was born December 21, 1886, in Eliasville, Texas. We are unsure of the year of her death as various family records have listed December 29, 1949, and 1963 for her death in Throckmorton, Texas. Nettie married James O. Crump of Mississippi and had two children: Dick and Marie.

1. Dick Crump died at the age of 15 months.

2. Marie Crump married J. S. Timmons and had two children: Janet and Peggy Lynn.

- B. Lewis E. Parrott was born September 16, 1888, in Eliasville, Texas. Various family records have listed conflicting death dates - March 4, 1968, and April 12, 1964. He married Myrtle Reamy and had four children: Lila, Ruby, Buster and Florence.

1. Lila Parrott became a registered nurse.

2. Ruby Parrott married J. C. Hill of Weslaco, Texas, and had two children: Jerry and Lynda.

3. Buster Parrott married Ada May Gay. They live in Throckmorton and have two children. Virginia and Sonny.

4. Florence Parrott married Orville Huston and had three children: Ruel, Raymond and Rex.

- C. William Arthur Parrott was born October 19, 1892, in Eliasville, Texas, and died April 12, 1964. He married Miss Hamsell from Greenville, Texas. They had nine children. Norma Jean, William A., Coleen, Carolyn, Josie, David, Jack, Tommy and Johnny.
1. Norma Jean Parrott married Joe Cumby of Abilene, Texas.
 2. William A. Parrott died September 28, 1905. He had two children.
 3. Coleen Parrott.
 4. Carolyn Parrott.
 5. Josie Parrott.
 6. David Parrott.
 7. Jack Parrott was a football star at Kansas University.

- D. Don Orvill Hermon Parrott was born in Eliasville, Texas, on March 25, 1890, and died December 14, 1958. He married Vera McBride who was a student at Kidd Key College in Sherman, Texas, and was from Oklahoma. They had five children: Richard, Donnell, Jimmy, Douglas and Philip.
- E. James Ermon Parrott was born September 3, 1897, in Eliasville, Texas, and Died September 22, 1975. He married Dotie Jones from Cross Plains, Texas and had two children: Patsy and Bobby.
- F. Evelyn Virginia Parrott was born on September 30, 1902 in Eliasville, Texas. She married Murray Bibb from Oklahoma and had four children: Kenneth, Joy, Jerry and Martha Carol. In 1975 a daughter was living in Abilene, a son in Rising Star, a daughter in Alaska, a son in Perrytown, Texas, and there were ten grandchildren.
- G. Walter Parrott was born October 14, 1890 and died September 18, 1900.
- H. Lloyd Parrott was born September 16, 1899 and died on September 18, 1900. (Ref. for Richard Parrott Family - Evelyn Parrott Bibb of Throckmorton, Texas)
- III. Elijah "Lige" Thomas Parrott was born August 21, 1853, in Tennessee, probably in Overton County. Family tradition names Nashville as Lige's birthplace. He was named for his uncle, Dr. Elijah Stover, who had married his aunt, "Mickey" Parrott. When Lige was six years old, his Uncle Elijah and Aunt Mickey deeded him a 65 acre farm on Eagle Creek, Overton County, Tennessee, in the event they had no children (Overton County Deeds, Vol. 9, September, 1859). Many years later when Lige was living in Throckmorton, Texas, he went to Tennessee to see this farm and passed it on to other heirs.

The 1880 Young County, Texas, census lists Elijah T. Parrott, 27 years, farmer and cattle trader. Shortly thereafter, he moved again, to Throckmorton County, acquired a ranch near Woodson and opened a mercantile business in Throckmorton, the county seat. He was successful, soon outgrew the original wooden store and built an additional larger stone structure. He handled groceries, drygoods, hardware, buggies and wagons, lumber, cotton and cattle, and also drove flocks of turkeys to the railhead. His sons entered the business with him as "E. T. Parrott and Sons". One of his sons, William Bramwell Parrott, took charge of the business after his father's death.

On August 3, 1888, Lige married Virginia Ann Massie at Throckmorton, Texas. Virginia was born near Pembroke in Christian County, Kentucky, in 1861, soon after the beginning of the Civil War. Her father was Judge John Bramwell Massie who was born in 1838 and died in 1910, and her mother was Betty Ann Massie who was born in 1839 and died in 1920. John and Betty were first cousins. The Massie family was practically destitute after the Civil War but all were lucky to be alive considering that half a million people died in battle. The one exception was George Massie, Jr., the father of Betty Ann Massie, who was killed in broad daylight, by bushwhackers or Yankee guerrillas, in 1865 in Pembroke while riding in his buggy with a wounded Confederate soldier. Virginia's father sold his farm in Kentucky for \$15,000 before coming to Texas in 1872, about the time that several of the Massie families moved to Texas. This was a handsome sum for the time. He organized a covered wagon caravan and set out for Texas with his family, his widowed father (William Martin Massie), and his brother-in-law, Virgil and Franklin Massie. Virginia told stories to her grandchildren of this trying journey; of being in a runaway wagon when the brakes failed on a steep hill; of crossing the Mississippi River on a ferry to enter the wild west; of being threatened in Little Rock, Arkansas, when carpetbaggers attempted to abduct the Massie's former Negro slaves from the encampment. She remembered her red-haired Uncle Virgil who drew a line in front of their camp and threatened to shoot anyone who crossed the line. After this event, the party was no longer molested. The Negro couple lived out their lives with the Massie family.

When the family finally arrived in Fort Worth, Virginia's father was encouraged to settled there but he decided to move the family further west. He went first to Long Creek, Parker County, near Cresson in Hood County, and later Grandbury, where Virginia attended college in her late teens. Before 1880 the family had settled in Throckmorton County where Virginia's father became the first officer of the county: the judge and clerk, the organizer and superintendent of the Methodist Church, and a rancher. During these several moves, the family had increased. Virginia had several sisters and one brother by the 1880's. They all were active church goers, interested in music and school teaching. They enjoyed a happy life on the frontier. The Indians had just recently left the area and the U. S. Cavalry was stationed at nearby Fort Griffin to keep the country secure. Remembering how the family suffered during Reconstruction days, Judge Massie never turned away a beggar or destitute person from his door as long as he lived. The Massie geneology is the subject of another book now in preparation.

In 1910 oil was discovered near Woodson at Breckenridge, Texas. Much oil exploration was carried out around Woodson, Texas. In the 1920's the ranches of Dick Parrott, Lige's brother, became valuable oil fields. Before Lige

died, he made provision that income from oil found on his ranch would be divided equally between his children, regardless of how the surface was owned. In 1926, oil was found on the ranch. Up to twenty wells were producing at one time. A boom town sprang up called Parrottville, but the flush production was short-lived. However, a few stripper wells have continued to produce for more than fifty years.

Elijah Thomas Parrott died in Throckmorton, Texas on July 10, 1919, and is buried in the Throckmorton Cemetery. Virginia died in 1938 and is buried in the same family plot.

Lige and Virginia had five children: William Bramwell, George Massie, Bonita, Elijah Thomas Jr. and James Massie.

A. William Bramwell Parrott was born May 14, 1889, in Throckmorton, Texas. Bramwell was educated at Polytechnic College in Fort Worth and went into the mercantile business with his father and ran the business for several years after his father's death. He later sold E. T. Parrott & Sons to John E. Morrison. Bramwell then operated his own business buying wheat for Bewley Mills in Fort Worth and also other commodities in Throckmorton County. In 1920 he went into the oil business. He helped Rieter Foster Oil Company, as well as other companies, secure leases, and helped to promote Woodson Oil Company in which he was a stockholder. In June, 1931, he was employed as an accountant for the Knights of Pythias Grand Lodge and Pythian Orphans Home. Bramwell moved to Weatherford to be near his office. In 1939, he resigned and moved back to his Throckmorton farm on account of his health and an injury from a car accident. Bramwell suffered a severe heart attack in 1947 and never fully recovered. He moved to Denton, Texas, in 1950, on the advice of his doctor, to be near one of his children. He died in Flow Memorial Hospital in Denton, Texas, on July 10, 1952, and was buried in Throckmorton.

On June 10, 1917, he had married Lucille Safronia Robinson in the First Methodist Church of Throckmorton. Lucille was born in Gustine, Comanche County, Texas, on May 28, 1891, and now lives in Throckmorton (Box 834). She is the daughter of Obadiah Robinson and Catherine Stephens. Obadiah was the son of William Robinson, one of the first missionary Baptist preachers in Texas. Born in North Carolina on January 11, 1809, William Robinson moved with his family at an early age to Marengo County, Alabama, where he grew to manhood. In 1840 he moved to Mississippi and in 1848 he moved to Louisiana. That year he crossed the Sabine River into Texas and settled in Rusk County. He was ordained in 1851. He organized or helped organize fourteen Baptist churches. Known as "Chocktaw Bill", he was described in his obituary as "a pioneer of pioneers, a trail blazer of the Gospel, a dauntless, valiant and intrepid scout of Jesus Christ." He died on February 22, 1898, and is buried in the Baggett Creek Cemetery. Lucy's mother, Catherine Stephens Robinson, was a member of an old Texas family. Her father was killed by Indians at Fort Belknap, Texas.

Bramwell and Lucy had four children: Elijah Bramwell, Katherine Ruth, Margaret Sangster and James Russell.

1. Elijah (Lige) Bramwell Parrott was born July 7, 1918, in Throckmorton, Texas. On February 18, 1943, he married Mary Kathryn Clark who was

born in Honey Grove, Fannin County, Texas. Lige was a veteran of World War II. He served in England and received a Purple Heart. After the war he was an irrigation machinery sales executive.

Lige was killed in an automobile accident on November 13, 1969. He and Mary Kathryn had three children: Pamela Jo, Bramwell Clark and Mark.

- a. Pamela Jo Parrott was born July 7, 1947, in Olney, Texas. She was married November 1, 1975, to Ernest Bayer of Cameron, Texas. They live in Austin, Texas, where Pam is secretary to a state senator.
 - b. Bramwell Clark Parrott was born August 5, 1955, in Honey Grove, Texas. He is an agronomist at Texas Tech University and lives in Lubbock, Texas.
 - c. Mark Parrott was born February 22, 1960, in Brownsville, Texas. In 1976 he was a high school senior in Seminole, Texas.
2. Katherine Ruth Parrott was born August 3, 1919, in Throckmorton, Texas. She graduated from Weatherford College. On November 23, 1938, she married Lloyd B. Cherry who was born in 1915 at Weatherford, Texas. They lived in Beaumont, Texas, where Lloyd was a prominent professor and Dean at Lamar State University before his death on August 11, 1974, in Wisconsin. A building at Lamar University was named for him. Katherine now lives at 1418 Crystal Drive in Beaumont. They had two children: Margaret Ann and Frank.
 - a. Margaret Ann Cherry married Osborne P. Wiggins, Jr. on June 4, 1968. After they divorced in 1974, she went to New York for a Doctor's Degree in Philosophy and to teach. He was teaching at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas.
 - b. Frank Cherry.
 3. Margaret Sangster Parrott was born December 31, 1922, in Throckmorton, Texas, and never married. From 1957 to 1971 she was Librarian of the Congressional and Public Documents Library in Raleigh, North Carolina. She had obtained a B.A. degree from North Texas State University in 1947 and her M.S. in Library Science from the University of North Carolina in 1957. She is now Assistant Professor of Library Science and English at the University of North Carolina in Greensboro.
 4. James Russell Parrott was born February 24, 1925, in Throckmorton. On May 16, 1958, he married Ruth Ayres of DeLeon, Texas, the daughter of Lewis Ayres. They had no children in 1976 and were living in Dallas where he is a graduate engineer. He served during World War II in the Pacific.
- B. George Massie Parrott, the second son of Elijah Thomas Parrott and Virginia Ann (Massie) Parrott, was born August 14, 1890, in Throckmorton, Texas. In 1910 he eloped with Mary Lorena Sellars who was born in Mineral Wells, Texas, on November 11, 1894. She was the daughter of Arthur

Lee Sellars and Hattie Bethea Owens (whose mother was a Bethea). Lorena Parrott was killed in an automobile accident near Winters, Texas, in May, 1923, and is buried in Throckmorton.

George Massie Parrott was later married to Myrtle Cherry for six years and then Mary Sorrells of Lamesa, Texas. He died June 14, 1948, in Lamesa without issue by Mary, and is buried at Throckmorton, Texas. His widow, Mary, later married Dee Huddle who died and she now lives in Snyder, Texas.

George attended business college in Waco, Texas, and was in the mercantile or automobile business for many years. There is a sidelight in the family concerning young George Massie Parrott, the favorite grandson of Judge John Bramwell Massie. On April 4, 1910, Judge Massie invited George to a dinner of fresh oysters. Oysters were a great rarity, being shipped on ice several hundred miles by rail and mule freight to West Texas. During the dinner, Judge Massie died suddenly.

George Massie Parrott and Lorena Sellars Parrott had two children: Mildred Elizabeth and George Bethea (Polly).

1. Mildred Elizabeth Parrott was born May 26, 1913 in Throckmorton, Texas. On July 1, 1933, she married Ben Reynolds Wilkinson. He was born August 31, 1910, in Throckmorton, the son of William Clark Wilkinson and Anna Florence Reynolds. Ben is a member of two famous pioneer ranching families of West Texas, the Reynolds and the Matthews, who came to Texas in the 1840's. The history of those families, recorded by Sallie Ann (Reynolds) Matthews, was first published in 1936 by Herbert Fletcher of Houston and again in 1938 by Carl Hertzog of El Paso, Texas, entitled Interwoven, A Pioneer Chronicle. We will include here an excursus on the Reynolds and Matthews families.

The first Benjamin Franklin Reynolds of Welsh-English descent married Sallie Barber. Among their several children was Barber Watkins Reynolds who was born in Oglethorpe County, Georgia. He married Anne Maria Campbell on January 31, 1841, in Chambers County, Alabama. She was one of the children of Archibald Campbell and Mary Graham Campbell. She was Scottish, descended from the houses of Argyle and Graham, and was born in Chesterfield District, South Carolina.

Barber Watkins Reynolds moved his family to Shelby County, Texas, in 1847 where they farmed for twelve years. Then they moved to West Texas in 1859 and settled near Fort Griffin on the frontier where his family had many encounters with the Indians. In West Texas, the Reynolds family soon became friends with a neighboring family, the Matthews, who had known the Campbells in Alabama. In subsequent years, many members of these families intermarried.

The Matthews family is first represented by John Matthews of Alabama who married Anna Beck. They had several children, including Joseph Beck Matthews who married Caroline Spears. Caroline was one of the children of Alexander Spears and Lucinda Maynor Spears. Joseph Beck Matthews moved his family first to Louisiana, then to West Texas to a ranch in what became Stephens County. There the Matthews became friends with the Reynolds family.

Joseph Beck Matthews and Caroline (Spears) Matthews had six children: Lucinda Elizabeth, John Alexander, Mary Jane, Martha Ann, Susan Alice and Rose Ella.

Barber Watkins Reynolds died on June 7, 1882. He and Anne Maria had eight children: John Archibald, George Thomas, William David, Susan Emily, Glenn Reynolds, Benjamin Franklin, Phineas Watkins and Sallie Ann. Three children from each family intermarried. We will list these marriages under the Reynolds family.

- I. John Archibald Reynolds was born in Alabama and died in childhood.
- II. George Thomas Reynolds was born in Alabama. He married in 1867 to Lucinda Elizabeth Matthews, the daughter of Joseph Beck Matthews and Caroline Spears.
- III. William David Reynolds was born in Alabama. He first married Mary Byrd in 1879 and then Susan Alice Matthews in 1879. Susan was the daughter of Joseph Beck Matthews and Carolina Spears.
- IV. Susan Emily Reynolds was born in Shelby County, Texas. She married on November 10, 1862, to Samuel Pierce Newcomb. Later she married Nathan Loomis Bartholomew.
- V. Glenn Reynolds was born in Shelby County, Texas. He married Augusta Lemont Russell. Glenn was sheriff of Giles County, Arizona, where he died November 2, 1889.
- VI. Benjamin "Bennie" Franklin Reynolds was born in Shelby County, Texas, in 1852 and moved to West Texas as a small boy. His family lived near Fort Griffin. Bennie grew up as a cowboy and rancher. In 1871 he helped his older brother, George Thomas Reynolds, drive a herd of cattle to Colorado. In 1872, at the age of 20, he was a trail boss for a cattle drive to Nevada and on to San Francisco. He saw the Indians rounded up and placed on a reservation near Fort Griffin and the buffalo exterminated by professional hunters. Bennie killed a rare white buffalo while in his teens. He took part in building the first school in the area. In 1889 he went to Giles County, Arizona, to settle the estate of his brother, Glenn, who was a sheriff and was killed by Apache prisoners while transporting them to the state prison.

Family tradition has it that Bennie thought there was a great future in the professional world. He read law and sold his interest in the family ranch and later went into the abstracting business in Throckmorton, Texas. Many other members of the family who retained their lands became wealthy from oil discoveries.

Bennie married Florence Matthews, the niece of Joseph Beck Matthews (see Matthews excursus), on May 5, 1879. Bennie and Florence had nine children, all born in Throckmorton County, either on a ranch on Clear Fork River or in Throckmorton. They were: Joseph, A. W., Anna Florence, George, Hattie, Caroline, Frank, Ruby and Ivy.

- A. Joseph "Joe" Reynolds.
- B. A. W. "Jack" Reynolds.
- C. Anna Florence Reynolds was born October 13, 1882, and died in 1975. She married William Clark Wilkinson on September 5, 1905. William was born August 28, 1881, in Young County, Texas, and died March, 1961, in Throckmorton. He was the son of William Calhoun Wilkinson, born in 1842, and Lucy Woods, born September, 1850, and died in 1936. Lucy and William

were married in Navarro County, Texas, in 1876. William Calhoun Wilkinson was a Confederate veteran. He moved the family to Young County before 1880. This family of Wilkinsons is said to have migrated from England to the United States in the early 1800's. William and Lucy had seven children: William Clark, J. Brice, Aubry, Earl, Oscar, Alice and Edna.

William Clark Wilkinson and Anna Florence (Reynolds) Wilkinson had eight children: Billy, Harry Matthews, Ben Reynolds, Caroline, Lucy, Zada, Elinor and Dorothy.

1. Billy Wilkinson who is deceased.
2. Harry Matthews Wilkinson who lives at 10906 Valley Hills in Houston, Texas.
3. Ben Reynolds Wilkinson was born August 31, 1910. He married Mildred Elizabeth Parrott on July 1, 1933. Mildred was born May 26, 1913, and was the daughter of George Massie Parrott and Mary Lorena Sellars. (See William Giles Parrott and his great-granddaughter, Mildred Elizabeth Parrott.)
4. Caroline Wilkinson married George Kunkel.
5. Lucy Wilkinson married Guy Moberley.
6. Zada Wilkinson married "Skeet" Hethcock who is deceased.
7. Elinor Wilkinson married Loyd Cogburn who is deceased.

VII. Phineas "Phin" Watkins Reynolds was born in Shelby County, Texas. He married in 1883 to Roseannah Marian Matthews, a niece of Joseph Beck Matthews and the sister of Florence Matthews who married Benjamin Franklin Reynolds. (See Matthews excursus.)

VIII. Sallie Ann Reynolds, authoress of Interwoven, A Pioneer Chronicle, was born in West Texas on May 23, 1861. She married in 1876 John Alexander Matthes, the son of Joseph Beck Matthews and Caroline Spears.

The other three children of Joseph Beck Matthews and Caroline Spears were:

Mary Jane Matthews who first married John M. Larn and later married John Brown.

Martha Ann Matthews who married Martin Van Buren Hoover.

Rose Ella Matthews who married Frank Eben Conrad.

John and Anna (Beck) Matthews also had another son, name unknown, who had at least two children: Florence and Rosa. This family had moved from Alabama to Arkansas. Florence went to Texas to visit her cousin (Lucinda Elizabeth Matthews who married George Thomas Reynolds) and met and married Benjamin Franklin Reynolds on May 6, 1879. "Bennie" was the brother of George Thomas Reynolds. The young couple was feted and given a wedding trip back to Florence's home in Arkansas. When they returned to Texas, Florence and Bennie brought with them Rose, Florence's sister, who married Bennie's brother, Phineas, on March 20, 1883.

At age 10, Mildred (Parrott) Wilkinson promised her dying mother that she would "tell everything" to "Granny" Parrott (Virginia Massie), with whom Mildred went to live. Mildred kept this promise as long as her grandmother lived. Before retirement in 1975, Ben Wilkinson spent his entire career with the Texas Highway Department as an engineer. The family lived in several Texas cities, and now he and Mildred live in Colorado City, Texas, at 1916 Locust Street. Mildred Elizabeth (Parrott) Wilkinson and Ben Reynolds Wilkinson had one son, Byron Reynolds.

- a. Byron Reynolds Wilkinson was born July 4, 1935, in Bowie, Texas. On February 16, 1952, he and Shirley Ann Elliott eloped to be married in Clovis, New Mexico. Shirley was born April 31, 1935, in Colorado City, Texas, the daughter of Lewis Beall Elliott and Elizabeth Wilson Elliott. Byron Wilkinson graduated in Civil Engineering from Texas A & M University in 1957 and worked for the State Highway Department for seven years. In 1974 he formed his own business, Agape Construction Company. He and Shirley live at 5822 Pine Arbor, Houston, Texas, and belong to the Evangelistic Temple Church.

Byron and Shirley have three sons: Byron Lawrence, Jeffrey Allen and Clayton Elliott.

- (1) Byron Lawrence Wilkinson was born December 20, 1952, in Colorado City, Texas. He married Deborah Kay Robinson on September 6, 1975. She was born in Houston in 1957. Byron works for his father.
 - (2) Jeffrey Allen Wilkinson was born February 13, 1958, in Waco, Texas.
 - (3) Clayton Elliott Wilkinson was born August 24, 1961, in Houston, Texas.
2. George Bethea "Polly" Parrott was born September 23, 1916, in Throckmorton, Texas. After her mother's accidental death in 1923, she lived with her "Granny" Parrott (Virginia Massie) in Throckmorton and

Abilene, Texas. On November 2, 1938, she married Macario "Carney" Carnohan. Only after they married did they discover that their families were related three generations before. Macario Carnohan's grandfather, Joseph Battle Carnohan, married Mary Massie in 1869 in Christian County, Kentucky. Mary was the sister of Bettie Ann Massie who married their first cousin, John Bramwell Massie, eventually to become the great-grandparents of Polly. This makes the children of Polly and Carney descendents through three lines from George Massie, Sr. (Louisa County, Virginia, 1760-1836).

Carney (also often called "Mac") was born on April 18, 1913, in Dallas, Texas, the son of William George Carnohan and Maie Rogers. Maie (Rogers) Carnohan was born in Lebanon, Tennessee on May 7, 1880 and in 1976 was living in a nursing home in San Diego, California. She and William were divorced in 1920 and he remarried. He died in Lake Charles, Louisiana, in August, 1948. A brief excursus on the Carnohan family is included here.

Joseph Battle Carnohan, Sr. was born March 8, 1833, in Spotsylvania County, Virginia a Confederate veteran who fought for four years without having a serious wound. He served in Longstreet's Division of the Army of Virginia and had enlisted on May 8, 1861.

After the Civil War, Joseph came to Texas and located land, probably in Young County. He returned to Kentucky to marry on December 23, 1869, and brought his bride, Mary Massie, to Texas where they were listed on the 1880 census of Young County.

Mary Massie was born in Christian County, Kentucky, in 1852, the daughter of George Massie, Jr. (1810/15-1863) and Elizabeth Ann Bollinger (1817-c.1884). She was a sister of Bettie Ann Massie who married her first cousin, John Bramwell Massie, and came to Texas about the same time as John Bramwell Massie, ancestors of George Bethea (Parrott) Carnohan. Joseph Battle Carnohan died in Arlington, Texas, in 1922. JOHN PARROTT
(1830-1901)
The son of Benjamin Parrott

John Parrott was born in Overton County, Tennessee, on March 1, 1830, and died there on June 8, 1901. He was buried in the Old Stover Cemetery. At the age of twenty-two, he married Parmelia (Permelia) C. Burgess of Overton County. She was born June 21, 1836, and was the daughter of Thomas Burgess, a native of North Carolina and a resident of Overton County. John and Parmelia were married December 28, 1852, at the residence of Thomas Burgess, witnessed by Cynthia Cooper and James Eudalay.

John was a saddlemaker and a farmer. The 1850 Overton County census showed him owning 100 acres and living with William G. Roberts and his wife, Sarah. The 1860 census shows his occupation as a saddler while the 1880 census shows him as a farmer.

After the Civil War, the John Parrott family moved to Texas for a few years. They lived in West Texas near John's brothers, Elijah Thomas and Richard Parrott. Parmelia died on November 14, 1891, and was buried in Ranger, Texas, according to their son, Charlie Browning Parrott. John Parrott then returned to Overton County and married Ferriba Ann Holt on December 19, 1895. He lived the rest of his life in Overton County. His widow, Ferriba, was born June 6, 1871, and died within six weeks of being 100 years old (May 11, 1971). She is buried at the Wirmingham Cemetery in Overton County. On her tombston is inscribed "A Tender Mother and a Faithful Friend."

John Parrott kept records of his family and his son, Charlie, inherited these records. We have used them for the genealogy of John Parrott.

John's first eight children were by Parmelia and the last two by Ferriba: William Winfield, Sabrina Florence, Edward B. Thomas, Washington L., Clarinda Gates, James Pompey, M. W. Ella, Joe G., Martha Geneva and Charlie Browning.

One family tradition states that John Parrott may have been the father of Bailey Stover who was born in 1851, before John's first marriage. Bailey's mother was Reene or Reenie Stover. Bailey's lineage has been included in this book as his descendants married into the Parrott family (see the chapter on Bailey Stover).

- I. William Winfield Parrott was born October 16, 1853, near Monroe in Overton County. He died there in 1927 without marrying. We think he spent some time in Texas.
- II. Sabrina Florence Parrott was born February 17, 1856, in Overton County and died there January 11, 1858.
- III. Edward T. Thomas "E. T." Parrott was born December 17, 1858, in Overton County and died in Wirmingham on April 5, 1919. E. T. had a thriving general merchandise store in Wirmingham, Tennessee, during the period when all his stock was hauled over the mountains by wagon, sometimes at considerable risk from outlaws. His granddaughter, Opal Parrott Stover, told the story of a gun battle when a silver dollar in E.T.'s overalls stopped a bullet.

E. T. was part of a posse formed in Clay County, where he was living at the time, to protect the town of Celina after the Sheriff was captured by the Williams gang. Ed killed J. W. Williams, one of the gang, after Williams tried to shoot him. The silver dollar stopped the bullet.

E. T. first married Sara Josie Waddell, the daughter of Dr. C. P. Waddell and Mary Phelps. Dr. Waddell's mother was Sara Waddell, born in 1826, reportedly the daughter of a Cherokee Indian chief. Josie was born January 15, 1866, in Overton County and died there July 12, 1904. She is buried next to E. T. at Wirtingham Cemetery.

E. T. then married Elsie Hill who was born October 19, 1884, the daughter of Johnnie and Manzie Hill. E. T. had fourteen children, the last four by Elsie Hill: Commodore C., Herman, an infant male, Bonza Ethel, Homer Hatton, Allard Gratton, Bessie Estelle, Roy, Linnie, Carson Kit, Hatton, Hollis, Connie and Edna.

A. Commodore C. Parrott was born August 2, 1885, in Overton County and died March 22, 1933, in Cookville, Putnam County, Tennessee. X. Charlie Browning Parrott was born March 21, 1899, in Overton County and was living in 1976, the last survivor of his generation of Parrotts. His father

was sixty-nine years old when Charlie was born. Charlie farmed the old Parrott place and ran a grist mill on Eagle Creek which operated even after World War II. It was one of the last to operate. During the Prohibition days, the moonshiners would come out of the mountains on horseback with a couple of sacks of corn to be ground at the Parrott mill for whiskey mash. The old mill is standing today.

On February 6, 1927, he married HESSIE KITTIE STOVER, the daughter of James Stover and Nettie Hammock. She was born July 28, 1907, and died January 29, 1961, at Vanderbilt University Hospital in Nashville. She is buried in the Wirmingham Cemetery in Overton County, Tennessee. Her father, James Stover, was the son of Jesse Stover, born 1854, and Delia Hicks. Jesse was the son of Hiram Stover, 1808-1900, and Minerva Phillips, born 1812. Hiram was the son of Lewis Stover, Sr., 1781-1850/60, and Betty, 1783-1850/60.

I visited Charlie in the Hospital in Cookeville, Tennessee, in July, 1976, and he talked about his descendants. He and HESSIE had six children: John Harrison, Katy Dean, Ruby Irene, James Bramble, Roy Lansden and Charles Cooper. Charlie and HESSIE have several grandchildren who are seventh generation citizens of Overton County. Three of their sons, Charles, James and Roy, are in business together as the Parrott Paving Company.

Old moonshiners would come down at night with two to three sacks of corn to grind for whiskey mash for their stills in the mountains. Roy raises cattle along with his sons, Roy and Jack, who also live on the farm. Roy and Jessie have two children: Roy Dale and Jack Louis.

PART II
THE STOVER FAMILY

THE STOVER FAMILY

The Stover family originated either in Germany or Switzerland where variations of the name include Staufer, Stouffer, Stoever, Staver, Stober, Stoeffer and Stiver. These families began migrating to America in the 1700's, most landing in either Virginia or Pennsylvania. Later these families migrated mainly to Ohio, Virginia, North Carolina and Tennessee.

A John Casper Stover, Sr. (no known relation to our Stover family) came to America in 1728 on the ship James Goodwill. David Crockett, from Rotterdam, was the ship's master. Stover was a missionary, born December 21, 1707, and died May 31, 1779. He married Maria Caterina Markling and had a son, John Casper Stover, Jr. who was born on March 10, 1736, and died in July, 1821. He married Anna Marie Barbara Nagel. Both Johns settled in Pennsylvania (Rupp, Pa. Archives and D.A.R. Patriot Index, p. 654-5).

Rev. William Stover, born in Switzerland in 1725, came to America in 1754 and built a stone house (a combination fort and dwelling) near Shady Grove, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania. He was a Revolutionary soldier, married Judith Shaeffer (born c. 1750), had eleven children, and died c. 1800 in Franklin County, Pennsylvania. One son, Dr. Stover, was born in 1748 in Switzerland, married Hannah Price (Preiss) and migrated to America to locate near Amsterdam, Botetourt County, Virginia. One son, John, married Elizabeth Strickler, and stayed in Botetourt County (Strickler, p. 87-88); Stover Quarterly, June 30, 1977, p. 6). Another son, Michael, was born in Franklin County in 1755 and died there in 1834. He married Christiana Hess. Their son, Jacob, was born in 1778 in Franklin County and died c. 1827 in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. There is no known connection of this family of Stovers to our family.

Another Stover from Switzerland was Jacob Stover. Jacob was "a native of Switzerland. He took land in Orange County, Virginia, for 'the settlement of himself and divers German and Swiss families, his associates, whom he proposes to bring thither to dwell in two years space.'" (Kegley's Virginia Frontier; Kegley, F. B., p. 33). In early 1733, Abraham Strickler (deceased by March 2, 1762) and six friends petitioned Gov. Gooch of Virginia for confirmation of their title to lands purchased from Jacob Stover. One man, Beverley, claimed the lands known by the name of Massanutton which Stover had sold to the seven. Beverley's provisional grant was dated May 5, 1732; another order of the council dismissed it December 12, 1733. Stover's provisional grant was dated July 17, 1730. Three days after Stover's grants were confirmed, a deed was issued for 10,000 acres in two tracts. Two years later, on December 15, 1733, Stover deeded to five men ten tracts totaling 3400 acres. Strickler's tract was probably in the heart of the settlement. Only two (Strickler and another) had signed the petition of 1733. The others probably became discouraged and gave up their rights or sold out to others before deeds were executed to them. Court records of Orange County, Virginia, show that Strickler and another had litigation with Stover between 1734 and 1739. The others probably anticipated litigation and settled on other lands. Stover's conveyance of the Massanutton tract of 5,000 acres in Orange County was as follows: Stone - 1100 acres on December 15, 1735 and 1050 acres on November 24, 1737; Selzer - 500 acres on December 15, 1735; Prupecker - 500 acres on December 15, 1735; Sowter - 300 acres on December 15, 1735; Strickler - 1000 acres on December 16, 1735; Clemon - 500 acres on September 16, 1735. The other 5000 acres must have remained in Stover's family

or was deeded to other men. (Strickler, Harry M.; Forerunners, A History or Genealogy of the Strickler Family, p. 32-34).

Jacob Stover died in Orange County in 1741 leaving a wife, Ruth, and a son, Jacob. The administrator of the estate was John Bowen (ibid, p. 406). A Jacob Stover, Jr. inherited the remains of the "upper patent," failed to pay rents and in 1746 forfeited same. This Jacob Stover, Jr. lived for three years at Bogota, Rockingham County, Virginia (ibid, p 407). Perhaps this was the son of immigrant Jacob and the land forfeited was the other 5000 acres of the Massanutton tract. In 1736 a Jacob Stover sold a 400 tract on the left bank of the river, part of the land on which he lived (Deed Book 1, p. 393, Orange County, Virginia). This could have been part of the Massanutton tract and was sold by Jacob Stover, Sr. before his death. As before, it is unknown whether Jacob was any relation to our family of Stovers.

There were others who came from Switzerland and Germany, but we have been unable to determine which was the father of Lewis Stover, Sr., with whom our lineage begins. Possibilities include brothers, Jacob and James, who were listed with a Lewis Stover in the 1800 North Carolina Census (p. 881, North Carolina Census). One Lewis was in Buncombe Conty. An Elijah Stover could have been the brother or father of Lewis. Because we have been unable to determine the parents or brothers and sisters of Lewis Stover, Sr., our ancestor, I have listed several Stovers towards the end of this chapter, some of whom may be the family of our Lewis Stover, Sr.

Mrs. Sheila S. Stover, a dedicated student of the Stover family, 204 Medcon Court, Cary, North Carolina, 27511, publishes the Stover Quarterly and has done some research for us toward establishing the parentage of Lewis Stover (1781-1850+), our ancestor, who was probably born in North Carolina.

Mrs. Sheila S. Stover believes that Lewis Stover (born in 1781) is most likely the son of Jeremiah Stover by his second wife. Jeremiah Stover of Virginia had (1) Jacob, (2) Jeremiah, (3) Obadiah, (4) Hezekiah, (5) John, by his first wife and five children by his second wife of whom we already know about Joseph and Ruth. Obadiah, Jacob, John and Jeremiah Stover moved to North Carolina. Apparently, Jacob Stover, born in 1774 in Virginia, with his wife, Sarah, born in 1774 in North Carolina, moved to Habersham County, Georgia. Also in Habersham County, Georgia, there was a Jacob Stover, born in 1802 in North Carolina, who had a 14 year old born in Tennessee (in 1836). Apparently, these are all from the family of Jeremiah Stover. Jeremiah Stover of Virginia was in all likelihood the son of Abraham Stover and wife Sarah of Shenandoah Valley, Virginia, who also had sons Daniel and Henry, according to Sheila Stover. It is also possible that our Lewis was a son of this Henry. Abraham Stover (Stauffer) probably was the son of Jacob Stover (Stauber) (Stover) and Sarah Boone discussed in preceding paragraphs.

Sheila Spencer Stover has been kind enough to allow me to publish some of her notes concerning the possible ancestry of our Lewis Stover (1781-1850/60).

From the Stover Quarterly, #6, p. 2, December, 1977:

"Quoting again from papers done by Media Research, Washington, D.C. dated 1915. These papers were among the effects of Walton F. Stover, of Linton, Indiana (1875-1942).

'Another early immigrant was Hans (John) Stauffer or Stouffer, who is said to have been a descendant of the ancient house of Hohenstaufen, in Saubia, and the son of Daniel Stauffer, a Mennonite, who removed from Switzerland to Alsheim, near the Rhine, in the German Palatinate, in the 17th century. Hans went to London, England, and then migrated to America about 1710. He settled in Pennsylvania with his wife, Kinget Heistand, widow of Michael Risser, and their children, Jacob, Daniel, Henry, Elizabeth and Mary. He also left a daughter named Amelia in Germany, and probably had issue at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, of another son, John, although this last is thought by some authorities to have been a nephew.

Jacob, son of the immigrant Hans, resided at Washington, Pennsylvania, and was the father there by his wife, Barbara, whom he married about 1722, of Henry, Christian, Susan, Esther, Abraham and John.

Daniel, son of the immigrant Hans, made his home at Colebrookdale, Pennsylvania, and left issue there of at least one son, named Abraham.

Henry, son of the immigrant Hans, married Magdalena Hess in 1735 and was the father by her in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, of Elizabeth, Christian, Veronica, Jacob, Magdalena, Abraham, John, Samuel, Henry and Anna.

.....

About 1729, the widow Veronica Stauffer or Stouffer, whose husband is believed to have been descended from the same line as the beforementioned immigrant, Hans, came from Switzerland or Germany to Philadelphia. She brought with her four sons, Henry, John, Samuel and Christian.

Henry, son of Veronica, settled in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, but records show some confusion between him and the son of the immigrant, Hans.

John, son of Veronica (same as the fore-mentioned son or nephew of Hans ??), was married in 1738 to Katrina Schenck, by whom he had eleven children in Lancaster County, one of whom was named Michael.

Samuel, son of Veronica, removed to Canada, and made his home near Toronto, but nothing is definitely known concerning his immediate family or descendants.

One Christian Stauffer or Stover (probably the youngest son of the widow, Veronica) settled in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania. According to some authorities, Christian was the father of nine children, Annalee, Mathias, Christian, Hans Ulrich, Peter, Jacob, Barbara, Henry and Elizabeth. Several of these removed to Virginia at an early date. (ed. note: Much research now shows that this Peter became the founder of Strasburg, Virginia, in all likelihood.)

One Jacob Stauber/Stauffer/Stover came from Switzerland in 1730 and settled in Page and Rockingham Counties, Virginia. He died in 1741, leaving at least one son, also named Jacob. (This is the Jacob Stover frm Switzerland who settled in Shenandoah Valley and may be our ancestor. Ed. note: by M. P. Kelsey)

One Henry Stauffer or Stover came from Prussia to America some time before 1749 and settled in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania. His wife, Barbara Hockman,

whom he married about 1749, was the mother of their children, Ulrich, Barbara, Henry, John, Jacob and Ralph.' "

Mrs. Sheila Spencer Stover's notes continued - 21 July 1977 -

Rev. Johan Casper Stoever in North Carolina

Johann Casper Stoever, Sr. (born in 1685 in Germany) emigrated to America in 1728 as a missionary with his son, Johann Casper Stoever, Jr., a student. He served a Lutheran group in Virginia and visited a German settlement near New Berne, North Carolina, probably before 1730.

He married, ca. 1730, a much younger woman, Maria Magdalena Pool, daughter of Mary Pool. Between 1730-1735 they had two children, Philip and Elizabeth.

Because of family disagreements, Stoever drew up an agreement with his wife, including a promise to support his mother-in-law. It was witnessed and recorded in "North Carolina at Graven Precinct, the 10th day of March, 1734." Many stipulations were enumerated! The entire agreement may be found in "Virginia Magazine of History and Biography", Vol. 14, pp. 142-143.

They then lived in Virginia where Stoever was serving the Hebron Congregation in Madison County. In 1735 the pastor and two members of the congregation, Michael Holt and Michael Smith, went to Germany to procure funds and materials for the Hebron Church. The mission was very successful, but on the homeward voyage, Stoever died and was buried at sea. However, the funds and materials with his complete inventory were brought home by Holt and Smith as was his will which they had witnessed.

Mary Magdalene Pool Stoever married George Holt, son of the above named Michael Holt, before 1743 and they moved to Orange County, North Carolina about 1760. On March 30, 1743, "George Holt, Henry Downs, Get., and Michael Holt gave bond for George Holt and Mary Magdalen, his wife, as guardians of Philip Stover and Elizabeth Stover (note the "e" dropped), orphans of John "Gauber" Stover, dec'd." (Orange County Will Book, I, pp. 63-4). No further information has been learned about Philip or Elizabeth.

John Casper Stover, Jr., married Anna Maria Barbara Nagel.

Possibilities of Parentage of
Lewis Stover (1781-1850/60)

Sheila Spencer Stover

For some time, I have been working with Stovers of every description, from many states, with varying migration patterns. While sorting and fitting these wandering families, a pattern developed, substantiating the fact that Jeremiah Stover was, indeed, a son of Abraham Stover, and grandson of Jacob Stover, land baron of Virginia. Interestingly enough, various members of Abraham's descendants and family members moved southward, spreading and mingling, causing those of us working on them today much confusion. The following are collected facts, notes, thoughts and theories, which time and further research will prove or disprove.

Abraham Stover, born about 1720 (?) in Virginia, was the son of Jacob Stover and his wife, Sarah Boone. Abraham was a minor at the time of his father's death which occurred in late 1740. Abraham had three sons (and probably other children): Daniel of Augusta County, Virginia; Jeremiah of Botetourt and Bedford Counties; and Henry, who went to Franklin County. No notation is made as to the whereabouts of Abraham's death, will, etc. However, in Colonial Records of North Carolina, Vol. #4, p. 1253, on 8 October 1751, Abraham Stover was granted 300 acres in Anson County, North Carolina. At that time, Anson County bordered Cumberland and Bladen Counties on the east, Rowan County on the north, and all of western North Carolina was still "open". It is unfortunate that Anson County is a "burned out" county... records for that area are at a premium.

Henry Stover is found on a partial tax list of 1785. (Misc. papers, Folio VI, North Carolina Archives) Henry is on the 1790 North Carolina Federal Census, Burke County, Morgan District with three males over 16, two males under 16, and seven females. He is on the 1800 North Carolina Census, still in Burke County; and a Henry, Jr., and an Isaac both are enumerated in the same area. These are probably the other two males who were "over 16" ten years earlier. Burke County was formed from Rowan County in 1777. Rowan was formed from Anson County in 1753 ...after the land grant to Abraham Stover in 1751. (Burke County court records, most land records, were destroyed by Federal troops in 1865.) I believe this Abraham is probably the son of Jacob Stover, Sr.

The 1790 North Carolina Census has Jeremiah Stover and Peter Stover in St. Asaph's District, Orange County, North Carolina; Michael Stover in Rowan County, North Carolina with one free male over 16 and five females; and John Abraham Stover in Salisbury District, Rowan County, North Carolina, with a male over 16, two males under 16 and one female. In 1800, John Abraham Stover and Peter Stover were both in Rowan County, North Carolina; Francis Stover in Stokes County, North Carolina; Lewis Stover in Buncombe County; and Jacob Stover in Rutherford County.

By 1820 everyone is gone except John Stover in Rutherford County, with one male under 10, one male 16 to 25, a female under 10, and a female 26 to 44. Marriage bonds of North Carolina show John Stover marrying Sally Waller on 1 June 1816 in Rutherford County, North Carolina; bondsman, Jacob Stover. Jacob and his wife Sarah were in Habersham County, Georgia, on the 1820 Census; drew land in Muscogee County, Georgia, in the 1827 land lottery; and were still in Habersham County on the 1850 Census where he and Sarah list their ages as both 76, he born in Virginia, daughter Rebecca still at home, age 55, born in North Carolina. Author Brent Holcombe of Columbia, South Carolina, stated that Jacob lived to be 104.

The 1820 Census also lists Obadiah Stover, Buncombe County, North Carolina, with two males under 10, one male 10 to 15, one male 16 to 18, and one male 45 or over; one female under 10 and one female 26 to 44. (This was almost certainly the son of Jeremiah.)

Jeremiah Stover, son of Abraham, had sons by his first wife (name unknown): Jacob, Jeremiah, Obadiah, Hezekiah, John and Joseph, who was born in Virginia, 11 September 1777. Jeremiah had a daughter, Ruth, who married a man with the surname of Profitt. They lived near St. Louis, Missouri. Jeremiah married secondly, "Mary". (records of Russell Stover family) According to the records of Euphemia Trine, great granddaughter of Jeremiah, there were five children of the second mar-

riage; but, in 1943, she had no records of them. Mrs. Trine descended from Jeremiah's son, Joseph, born in 1777, who, according to Mrs. Trine, did not care for his stepmother and went, briefly, to live with his brother Jacob whose wife was red-headed and named Sarah or "Sally". Joseph stayed only a short while and went on to Tennessee where he married Esther Yount of Tennessee and had a child or two. The family then migrated to Indiana and on west. Mrs. Trine's records show that Joseph's eldest brother Jacob lived to be 107...a discrepancy of 3 years with Mr. Holcomb's account. (A 4 and 7, written, could easily be mistaken.)

Jeremiah is shown in the Virginia Tax lists in Bedford and Botetourt Counties, 1782 and 1784. He (or possibly his son, Jeremiah) appears in North Carolina in 1790. The 1800 lists do not show the name by any spelling in North Carolina; and in the 1800 lists for Virginia do not exist. Jeremiah is said to have served in the Revolution.

Wilkes County, North Carolina, Taxables, 1805, Capt. J. Stanley's District, lists Jeremiah Stover with no polls and 230 acres.

Wilkes County, North Carolina Will Book 2, #226...The Will of Jeremiah Stover, Senior--written 26 November 1807 and probated during the February Court term, 1808. It mentions sons Jeremiah and John..."If equal division of land not specified in deed given, land to be equally divided as well as all estate. Land on Hunting Creek to be divided equally." The executors were Joshua Souther and Pressley Bussel, Sr. Witnesses: Henry Souther, William Lunsford and Ame (Ann) Souther.

#233-235..May term, 1808..Account of sale of the Estate of Jeremiah Stover, decd. Among the many purchasers were Isaac Stover Howell and Jeremiah Stover.

Wilkes County Wills, #155, Will of James Fletcher, 26 April, 1805. Witnesses: Hiram Roussau, Samuel Profitt and Barbara Stover.

Deed Book F1, Wilkes County, North Carolina, by Asher..Barbara Stover is mentioned on page 221, 243, 504, 557....Jeremiah is on page 542, John on 542 and Patrick on 544.

Wilkes County, North Carolina, Marriages, show Anna Stover marriage to Aaron Roberts, 18 February 1800, and Isaac Stover to Margaret Hoots, 7 December 1818.

Petition for "femme sole" by Aley Banks of Burke County, North Carolina... Jeremiah Stover was one of the certifying neighbors...referred to committee by House, 11 November 1813.

Obadiah Stover and Jacob Stover were mentioned at the estate sale of Jesse Corn, 17 April 1809, in Patrick County, Virginia. (Patrick County borders Stokes and Surry Counties, North Carolina. At that time, Wilkes County bordered Burke, also Surry.)

This Jeremiah Stover, Obadiah Stover and Jacob Stover are probably the sons of Jeremiah Stover, son of Abraham Stover.

By 1820, Lewis Stover is shown in Jackson County, Tennessee. In 1830 he is in Jefferson County, Tennessee. In 1840 and 1850 he is in Overton County, Tennessee. The 1850 Census shows him to be born in North Carolina about 1781. Lewis' wife Elizabeth was also born in North Carolina about 1783; and, as indicated by the 1800

census, they were married in North Carolina. Both Lewis and an Elisha Stover are listed as having fought in the War of 1812, with enlistments shown in September and October of 1814, State of Tennessee.

The 1850 Georgia Census shows a Jeremiah Stover, born in North Carolina about 1795, with sons Elisha - 16, Benjamin - 14, and Henry - 11, etc. (all born in Georgia); and in the same county, Elisha Stover, age 37, born in North Carolina (this man married Ruth Ralston in Lumpkin County, Georgia, 28 August 1836, and the line forward is completed). Cherokee County, Georgia, shows John Stover, age 50, born in North Carolina, with several of his children born in South Carolina. In Lumpkin County, Georgia, is Joseph Stover, age 55, born in North Carolina. Habersham County, Georgia, 1850, lists Hezekiah Stover, 40, born in North Carolina; Jacob, Sr., born in Virginia (sic), born in North Carolina, wife Sarah, age 76, born in North Carolina, and daughter Rebecca, age 55, born in North Carolina. On either side of this family was Jacob Stover, Jr., age 21, wife Harriet, age 18, both born in Georgia, and Jacob Stover, age 48, born in North Carolina, a widower, with four children of whom the oldest were born in Tennessee and the youngest in Georgia. Also listed is Jeremiah Stover, age 52, born in North Carolina, wife Martha, age 43, born in North Carolina, with eleven children; and Michael Stover, age 36, born in North Carolina, wife Mary, age 30, born in Tennessee, with six children. Living among these families was William Stover, age 35, born in South Carolina, with his wife Mary, also born in South Carolina.

The names in the 1830-1850 Tennessee Census have many similarities with the North Carolina, Georgia group. The 1830 Alabama Census shows Abraham, Elisha, Josiah, William B. By 1840, Elisha and Josiah were in Arkansas, and the 1850 Census shows them to have been born in Virginia in 1794 and 1806. Abraham, Obadiah and Elijah remained in Alabama, and the 1850 Census shows them to have been born in Virginia, also, with younger Stovers coming from Tennessee, South Carolina and Georgia.

Obadiah Stover, son of Henry (who was brother to the eldest Jeremiah), went from Franklin County, Virginia, to Raleigh County, West Virginia; and we are able to account for almost all of his descendants. The few who are nebulous are the ones who went to South Carolina and Tennessee. Names that occur in Obadiah's descendants that can be found in both West Virginia and South Carolina are Alfred, Stanford, Lewis, as well, of course, as the familiar pattern of names.

The pattern of migration of Jeremiah and his brothers is upper to lower Virginia and, for Jeremiah's direct descendants, North Carolina to Tennessee, with several continuing on to Georgia.

Jeremiah is said to have had five children by his second marriage. His last child by the first marriage was born in 1777. Lewis Stover of Buncombe County, North Carolina, and Tennessee was born about 1781. Was he one of these children? Another possible father is Henry Stover of Burke County, North Carolina. In 1790 he was listed as having two males over 16 and two males under 16, one of which could have been Lewis. Lewis was married by 1800 and living in his own household, as were Henry, Jr., and Isaac. These men could have been brothers. They lived in the same general area. They appear and disappear from the North Carolina Census about the same time.

That these North Carolina, Tennessee, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, and Arkansas Stovers are all related is a certainty. They carried the same Christian names, migrated in the same patterns, bore their children in the same states, lived

in close proximity to one another, with descendants moving further west together. It is my contention that further research in Georgia, Alabama and Arkansas will turn up documentation to support my findings and that proof of parentage for Lewis Stover, and his suspected brothers and sisters, will be found by researching this group in depth.

Before we go on to discuss our family, we have listed other Stovers who may, or may not, be some relation to our family of Stovers.

DANIEL STOVER

Daniel Stover was born in 1757 and died in 1822. He married Barbara Benedict and was a private from Pennsylvania in the Revolutionary War. (D.A.R. Patriot Index, p. 65)

Daniel Stover was born in 1780 and lived in Preble County, Ohio. (Strickler, Harry, M.; Forerunners, A History of the Strickler Family, p. 87)

Daniel Stover was a sargeant in the War of 1812, enlisting October 18, 1813, under Col. Samuel Wear and Capt. Jesse Cole. He was in the volunteer infantry. (War of 1812 Rolls, Tennessee)

Daniel Stover was the brother-in-law of Mary (Ward) Lincoln (wife of Isaac Lincoln), a cousin of Abraham Lincoln. This Daniel had a grandson, Daniel, who married Mary Johnson (1823-1883), the daughter of President Andrew Johnson who died at their home near Elizabethtown, Tennessee, on July 31, 1875. Daniel was born August 20 or 25, 1820, and died November 28, 1838. He was named as a nephew of Mary Ward Lincoln in her will dated April 22, 1816. Mary Johnson then married W. R. Bacon of Greenville, Tennessee. Daniel and Mary had a son, William. I believe this was the Daniel Stover who was a colonel from Carter County, Tennessee, and had children Lily who married Thomas Maloney, Sarah who married Mr. Baughman, and Andrew Johnson Stover. (Ray, Worth S.; Tennessee Cousins, p. 69)

ELIJAH STOVER

Elijah Stover was a private in the War of 1812 and enlisted September 20, 1814, under Col. William Johnson and Capt. Andrew Lawson. He was in the East Tennessee Draft Militia. This could possibly be a brother or father of Lewis Stover, Sr. (War of 1812 Rolls, Tennessee).

ELIZABETH STOVER

Elizabeth Stover married William Lambert and had at least one son. (Strickler, Harry M.; Forerunners, A History of the Strickler Family, p. 86)

Elizabeth (Strickler) Stover Ball married John Ball on October 18, 1827. He was born May 16, 1777, and died March 28, 1838. She had first married a Stover (ibid, p. 86).

Elizabeth Stover, age 42, was listed on the 1870 Overton County, Tennessee, Census with children: William, 19, Ema, 17, Louis 15, the widow of John Stover.

Elizabeth Stover, age 50, born in Tennessee, was listed on the 1860 Overton County Census with children: Manerva, 23, a baby girl, 6, and John, 2. She was not on the 1850 Overton County Census.

Elizabeth Stover married Mr. Crosland. Her will, written October 18, 1693, in Albemarle County, Virginia, mentions her father, Richard Stover. This Richard Stover was executor for John Croslen (sic) whose will mentions a god-daughter Constant, and Rich, Ann, Henry and Johanna Stover (Stiver). John Croslen's will was written May 6, 1693 (Abstract of wills of Albemarle County, 1690-1760, by Grimes).

JACOB STOVER

Jacob Stover was listed in the 1800 Federal Census of North Carolina as being in Rutherford County. (1800 Federal Census of North Carolina.)

Jacob Stover was the son-in-law of Peter Ruffner, son of Peter. His wife was probably named Mary. Jacob's will was probated in 1772. (Strickler's, p. 119)

The D.A.R. Patriot Index, p. 65, lists the following Jacob Stovers:

Born May 2, 1754, and died March 20, 1839. He married Susanna Huff and was a private in the War of 1812, from Pennsylvania.

Born c. 1754 and died March 28, 1807. He married Eve ____ and was a soldier from Pennsylvania in the War of 1812.

Born May 13, 1757 and died April 28, 1844. He married first to Elizabeth Swatz and then to Catherine Stover. He was a soldier in the War of 1812 from Pennsylvania.

Born in 1735 and died in 1820. He married Elizabeth Witwer and was a private in the War of 1812, from Pennsylvania.

Born July 19, 1761, and died January 24, 1839. He married Barbara ____ and was a soldier from Pennsylvania in the War of 1812.

Born c. 1753 and died January 13, 1817. He married Elizabeth Ruffner. He was a soldier in the War of 1812, from Virginia.

The War of 1812 Rolls in Tennessee lists the following Jacob Stovers:

Private, enlisted January 5, 1814, under Col. Ervin Allison and Capt. Adam Winsell, East Tennessee Draft Militia, on command at Ft. Strother, May 2, 1814.

Private, enlisted January 10, 1814, under Col. John Brown and Capt. Charles Lewin, East Tennessee Mount Infantry.

Private, enlisted May 2, 1814, under Col. S. Bunch and Capt. George McPherson, East Tennessee Militia; joined May 2, 1814, for Capt. Lewin's Company.

Private, enlisted September 20, 1814, under Capt. William Henderson as a spy; died January 20, 1815.

JOHN STOVER

John Stover was born December 24, 1758, and died March 5, 1845. He married Elizabeth Yerger. He was a private from Pennsylvania in the War of 1812. (D.A.R. Patriot Index, p. 64-65)

John Stover was born c. 1760 and died 1836. He married first to Nancy Shellenburger and then to Ester __. He was a private from Pennsylvania in the War of 1812. (ibid)

John Stover was a second lieutenant in the War of 1812, enlisting November 13, 1814, under Col. Samuel Bayless and Capt. Joseph Rich. He was in the East Tennessee Infantry. (Tennessee War of 1812 Rolls)

John Stover was listed in the 1820 White County, Tennessee, Census showing 220001-31100. (1820 White County Census, p. 342).

John Stover was listed in the 1850 Davidson County, Tennessee, Census, as age 57, blacksmith, born in Pennsylvania, with wife, Kitty, age 52, born in Tennessee, and Jacob, 19, laborer, born in Tennessee and four other named children. (Davidson County Census, p. 326)

John E. Stover was born February 19, 1852, in Blair County, Pennsylvania. (Stover Quarterly, June 30, 1977, p. 3) This is possibly a brother to Anna Stover who was born in Blair County April 6, 1849.

JOSEPH STOVER

Joseph Stover of Page County, Virginia, was a revolutionary soldier. He married Ann __. (Strickler, p. 383)

In 1914, J. H. Biddle, Postmaster at St. Paris, Ohio, owned a house Joseph Stover lived in. Joseph's wife was a Strickler and they had sons William and Frank. Joseph lived to be quite old, probably 80. He built the house about 1850 for a hotel (at least he used it for that purpose during the war). According to M.R. Shen, Joseph married Ann Strickler on December 7, 1813. M. O. Stover of Mohomet, Illinois, had a great-uncle Joseph who lived and died near West Alexandria, Ohio, who emigrated with his father, David, from Shenandoah County, Virginia, near Strasburg about 1825. (ibid)

LEWIS STOVER

Lewis Stover was a private from Tennessee in the War of 1812, enlisting November 24, 1814, under Col. William Metcalf and Capt. William Mullin. He was in the military infantry. (War of 1812 Rolls, Tennessee)

Lewis Stover was a private in the War of 1812, enlisting November 13, 1814, under Col. William Metcalf and Capt. William Sitton in the military infantry. (ibid)

Lewis Stover was listed in the 1820 Jackson County, Tennessee Census (p. 24) showing 300010-12010.

Lewis Stover was listed in the 1830 Jefferson County, Tennessee Census (p. 155) showing 22120001-0100101. This includes an old couple (50-60's) which were perhaps his parents.

WILLIAM STOVER

William T. Stover was born December 24, 1823, in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. He married Margaret Berry on June 22, 1848, and died January 25, 1908, in Hamilton County, Iowa. (Stover Quarterly, June 30, 1977, p. 3)

William F. Stover was born November 27, 1850, in Blair County, Pennsylvania, and died January 31, 1851, in Pennsylvania. (ibid)

LEWIS STOVER, SR.
(1781-1850/60)

Lewis Stover, Sr., our ancestor, was born in 1781 in North Carolina, but we have not been able to locate which county. He married Elizabeth (Betsy) _____ who was born in North Carolina in 1783. Her parents are unknown. Lewis and Betsy Stover migrated to Tennessee after 1800, the last date when Lewis was listed in the North Carolina census. He next appeared in the Tennessee census in 1820 and again in 1830, 1840 and 1850. One Stover related that Betsy, along with some other women, traveled alone over the mountains from North Carolina on horseback to Tennessee to obtain land grants. It seems that the Indians feared or would not attack the white woman. Betsy obtained a land grant, most likely in Overton County, Tennessee and then went back to North Carolina to return later with her husband, Lewis Stover, Sr., and their children.

Lewis and Betsy died between 1850 and 1860. They were both last listed in the 1850 census for Overton County, Tennessee, and not shown in the 1860 census. On March 8, 1837, he bought an undetermined amount of acreage on the "waters of Eagle Creek" in Overton County from George W. Sevier of Davidson County, Tennessee, for \$25 as evidenced in that deed in the Overton County Deeds. On October 1, 1840, Lewis bought 40 acres on "the waters of Eagle Creek" from Sevier for \$20. This was bounded by land belonging to Good, Parrott and another tract of land belonging to Lewis Stover (probably the first tract he bought from Sevier). On January 26, 1876, Catherine, the administrator of Joseph W. Stover's estate (son of Lewis), deeded these two tracts to Joseph's brothers, Lewis Stover, Jr. and James Stover, per a contract, part oral and part written, made by Joseph before his death. The amount of \$175 had been paid to Joseph prior to his death and the balance of \$25 was paid to Catherine. As stated in the deed, these tracts were "the real estate of Lewis Stover, Sr....where Lewis Stover, Sr. lived." (Overton County Deed Book A, p. 160).

Lewis Stover, Sr. was buried in the Old Stover Cemetery in Overton County, Tennessee. He and Betsy had eight children: Elizabeth, Elijah, James, Hiram, Lewis Jr., Joseph, Mary and John.

ELIZABETH STOVER
(1810-after 1840)
Daughter of Lewis Stover, Sr.

Elizabeth Stover was born in 1810 in Overton County, Tennessee, and is buried in the Old Stover Cemetery. Family tradition states that Elizabeth never married. She is last listed in the 1840 census of Overton County, not by name, but as a female, the child of Lewis Stover, Sr. No further information has been found on this child.

ELIJAH STOVER
(1813-after 1870)
Son of Lewis Stover, Sr.

Elijah Stover was born in 1813 in Overton County, Tennessee. He first married Micah Parrott, the daughter of Benjamin Parrott, whose genealogy is a part of this book. Micah was born in 1822 in Overton County. She evidently died between 1850 and 1860 as she was not listed with her husband and their son, Westley, in the 1860 census. After Micah's death, Elijah married Sarah Reneau in 1861. She was born in 1819. There were no children of this marriage.

Elijah Stover was a farmer listed in the 1870 census. On July 25, 1859, the heirs of Benjamin Parrott (William Giles Parrott, John Parrott and Catherine (Parrott) Stover and her husband, Joseph Stover, (brother of Elijah) conveyed to Micah and Elijah "the same tract where on the said Elijah and Michael (sic) now resides." The deed stated that this land would go to Elijah Thomas Parrott, the son of William Giles Parrott, if Micah and Elijah died without children. If Elijah Thomas Parrott was not alive at the time of their death, the land would go to Joseph Benjamin Parrott, another son of William Giles Parrott. (Overton County Deed Book A, p. 98). Many years later when Elijah Thomas Parrott had grown up, he went to Tennessee to see this farm he had inherited and passed it on to other heirs.

Elijah Stover had only one child, Westley.

- I. Westley Stover was born in 1845 in Overton County, Tennessee. He was last listed in the 1860 census of Overton County and evidently died before 1870 at which time his parents deeded their land to Elijah Thomas Parrott. There has been some speculation that Westley was adopted, but we have found no proof.

JAMES STOVER
(1815-)
Son of Lewis Stover, Sr.

James Stover was born in 1815 in Overton County, Tennessee. He married Flora ___ who was born between 1817 and 1820, according to the 1850 and 1860 census for Overton County. Family records belonging to her grand-daughter, Cora Stover Robbins, show her death in 1887.

Little is known about James Stover. He and Flora had five children: James, George, Nancy, Elizabeth and Lucinda.

- I. James Stover was born in 1844 and family tradition states that he died in the Civil War. He probably never married.
- II. George Stover was born in 1846 in Livingston, Overton County, Tennessee. He married Alvera (Myra) Stover, the daughter of John Stover (George's uncle) and Elizabeth McMillian. Myra was born in 1858 and died in 1896, according to family records. George's death date is unknown but he was buried in the George Stover Cemetery. Myra is buried in the Old Stover Cemetery where there is no inscription, but several living relatives remember her burial. George and Myra had ten children: Nettie, Oanner, Ridley, Winfield, John Newton, Flora Elizabeth, Westley, Foister McMillian, Ida and Cora.
 - A. Nettie Stover was born in 1876 in Overton County, Tennessee and died in 1965 without marrying.
 - B. Oanner Stover was born July 16, 1878, in Overton County and died August 21, 1911, in Oakley Community, Overton County. She is buried in the Old Stover Cemetery. Oanner married Ras Ledbetter, the son of Elijah Ledbetter and Ann Garrett. He was born in March, 1873, in Overton County and died in May, 1948, in Allons, Tennessee. He is buried in the Old Stover Cemetery. Oanner and Ras had five children: Avda, Harrison, Ida, Herford and Nora.
 1. Avda Ledbetter was born in 1901 in Allons, Tennessee. She married Douglas Richardson.
 2. Harrison Ledbetter was born in 1903 in Allons, Tennessee. He married Dona Allred.
 3. Ida Ledbetter was born in 1906 in Allons and married Hoy Clark.
 4. Herford Ledbetter was born in 1909 in Allons and married Flora Ray.
 5. Nora Ledbetter was born August 7, 1911, in Allons. She married Lewis Franklin Stover, the son of Joe Stover and Judie Short. Lewis was born in 1901 in Willow Grove, Clay County, Tennessee, the grandson of Bailey Stover and Ellen Bruington. According to his grave marker in St. John's Cemetery in Willow Grove, Bailey Stover was born in 1851 and died in 1902. Family tradition has it that Bailey's mother was Reene or Reenie Stover and that she had Bailey out of wedlock. His father is said to have been John Parrott, but none

of these stories have been proven. Clarice (Stover) Carmichael of Livingston, Tennessee, has been researching this line for us and is still searching for a Reene Stover through relatives in Missouri. Since this line did intermarry with our Stover families, I have included a chapter on Bailey Stover's descendants in this book.

Nora and Lewis Stover had eleven children: Claudine, Charlie, Lola, Veola, Betty Lou, Joe Ras, Elean, Patsy, Kenneth Wayne, Linda Sue and Roger Lewis.

(1818-1900)
Son of Lewis Stover, Sr.

Hiram Stover was born on June 24, 1818, in Overton County, Tennessee, according to his cemetery marker in Willow Springs, Missouri, where he died in 1900. Hiram married Minerva Phillips, the daughter of Beaty Phillips. She was born in 1822 in Overton County and died in 1909 in Livingston, Overton County, Tennessee. She is buried in the Old Stover Cemetery in Overton County.

On October 15, 1850, Hiram Stover bought the undivided interests in 600 acres of land on Eagle and Ashburn Creeks in Overton County which Beaty Phillips, deceased, left to his heirs: John W. Phillips, Minerva Phillips (who married Hiram), Louisa T. Phillips who married Henry C. Clark, and others. This three-ninths interest was then sold to Obadiah Hickey the same day for \$400 which included the interest of Phoebe Phillips, the widow of Beaty, at her death.

Hiram and Minerva had ten children: Eliza Jane, Jesse W., Martha Ann, Amanda Sarah, Joseph Henderson, Emily Katherine, Phoebe Elizabeth, Mary Sabrina Florence, Pleasant Hiram and Beaty Phillips. Most of the information on these children was obtained from an old family Bible of Grant Stover Smith's, now in the possession of Pleasant Stover's step-daughter, Nona Dial, who lives in the old Hiram Stover home. Some dates were obtained from grave markers.

- I. Eliza Jane Stover was born in 1841 in Overton County, Tennessee. She married Thomas Alva Howard who was born January 18, 1847, and died in February, 1930. He was born in Overton County. Eliza and Thomas had two children: Joe and John Henry.
 - A. Joe Howard was born in 1881 and died in 1964 according to the marker on his grave in Celina, Tennessee. He married Lattie Gunnels who was born in 1895 and died in 1959.
 - B. John Henry Howard reportedly went West when he was a young man. No dates or accounts of his whereabouts have been found. He is said to have married Sam Pennington's mother.
- II. Jesse W. Stover was born October 26, 1844, near Monroe, Overton County, Tennessee. He died on March 18, 1925, and is buried in the Jesse Stover Cemetery which is in Overton County, near Livingston. Jesse married Adelia Hicks who was born January 18, 1847, and died in 1930. She is also buried in the Jesse Stover Cemetery.

Jesse, reportedly a gunsmith, filed an Invalid Pension application on October 10, 1895. The application shows he enlisted September 1, 1864, for service in the Civil War, was discharged on August 25, 1865, and pensioned September 25, 1891, for tumors, partial deafness and sarcoma. In a declaration filed May 21, 1890, Jesse alleged that around August 1, 1864, he contracted typhoid fever resulting in sarcomas, or lumps, on his body, an infection of the hand and partial deafness. The pension was refused on the grounds that no records could be found of his service under Company D of the First Tennessee Mounted Infantry in which he was supposed to be a private. (This application also lists Company K of the Fourth Tennessee Mounted Infantry in which he served

as a corporal - this company was listed on a later form.) On October 26, 1912, Jesse filled out a pension form regarding his marriage. He stated that he married Adelia Hick (Hix) on October 6, 1886, in Jackson County, Tennessee, and that the record of the marriage was burned along with other family records. On April 3, 1915, he stated in another form that he served in Company K, having enlisted near Monroe, Tennessee. He again stated that he married Adelia Hicks who was formerly married to Jesse Laxton on September 14, 1862. Jesse Laxton died at St. Louis, Missouri, about January, 1863. Laxton served in Col. Dibrell's regiment. Birth dates of Jesse Stover's children are also listed on these forms.

After Jesse's death in 1925, Adelia Stover applied for a Widow's Pension but evidently had difficulty establishing her lawful marriage to Jesse Stover. The application was later accepted.

Jesse Stover and Adelia Hicks had ten children: Jim W., Hiram, Thomas, Elijah, Oliver, Jesse Lewis, John Wesley, Minerva Melvina, Benjamin Harrison and Alex Martin.

(1820-1887)
Son of Lewis Stover, Sr.

Lewis Stover, Jr. was born on September 13, 1820, in Overton County, Tennessee, and died there October 17, 1887. He was buried in the Old Stover Cemetery. Lewis married Jan McMillan who was born September 10, 1821, and died October 21, 1887, four days after her husband. She was buried beside Lewis.

Lewis Stover, Jr.'s will, written April 6, 1887, left his real estate to "my three boys." His personal effects, property and everything else was left to his wife. After her death, everything was to be divided equally between Belinda Stover, a daughter, and A.W. Stover (Lewis' son Andrew?). The will was proven in court by B. R. Stover, a son, Alex Stover (a cousin?) and T. G. Stover, a son. The will was filed on November 7, 1887 (Overton County Will Book, p. 400).
